

DEFINITION OF CRITERIA FOR APPLICANTS APPLYING TO THE LOS ANGELES UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GIFTED MAGNET PROGRAM OR SCHOOLS FOR ADVANCED STUDIES (SAS)

Gifted Magnet Program and SAS Sites: Serve students who demonstrate the ability or strong potential to work two years above grade level in academic subjects. These programs offer enriched interdisciplinary academic environments that are exciting, challenging and encourage students to use creative/critical thinking skills.



DOCUMENTATION TO PROVE VERIFICATION OR NON-VERIFICATION MUST BE KEPT ON FILE AT THE SENDING SCHOOL SITE FOR FIVE YEARS.

Must be identified as gifted by LAUSD prior to Α. the deadline. (Student must attend an LAUSD school to be assessed.)

OR

Student received national percentile scores of 85 or В. above OR Standard Exceeded on a District-approved standardized achievement test in 2023, if applicable.

The student must be in the MISIS system of LAUSD, and LAUSD must have determined eligibility as gifted in the Intellectual, High Achievement (HA), Specific Academic (SA), Creative or Leadership Ability category by the deadline of November 17, 2023. This criterion does not include students on waiting lists to be tested or students whom school personnel "feel" are potentially gifted.

These scores are based on the most recent District-approved standardized achievement tests given. These are the <u>national percentile</u> scores in <u>both</u> reading and mathematics (no other report or document should be included):

The student must demonstrate mastery in ALL FOUR of the following critical thinking and problem-solving skills (in primary language) and demonstrate the ability or strong potential to work two years above grade level in academic subjects by November 17, 2023; student's ability must not be anticipated beyond this date. Examples of possible student behaviors which demonstrate the characteristics follow each criterion below. These characteristics must be expressed or documented by evidence which may contain the following examples: writing samples that showcase extensive vocabulary, annotations of class activities and discussions/journals, logs, assignments and projects that demonstrate depth and complexity, etc. The principal/administrative designee must maintain documentation of verification or nonverification on file at the school site.

Note: Kindergarten SAS applicants must also be verified using the SAS kindergarten-specific criteria on the Verification of Eligibility (SAS Kindergarten) form.

- Explain meanings or relationships among facts, information or concepts that demonstrate depth and complexity
- · Analyzes similarities and differences in events, people and things
- · Displays high level observation skills that frequently detect fallacies and inconsistencies
- Grasps new concepts easily; moves rapidly from familiar (concrete) to unfamiliar (abstract)
- Sees hidden meanings or cause-and-effect relationships that are not obvious
- · Analyzes and evaluates respective solutions from multiple points of view
- Formulate new ideas or solutions and elaborate on the information
- · Plans unique projects by integrating learning from different areas
- Produces detailed steps of a solution and sound reasons for them
- · Invents solutions to established problems; creates problems for which there are no apparent solutions
- · Approaches tasks in different, unusual and original ways
- · Locates, selects and uses relevant information and material
- · Gives examples of possible outcomes; makes "educated guesses"
- · Thinks of and asks provocative questions which involve logical thinking processes
- Uses standard math processes and proficiencies such as problem-solving, abstract reasoning, constructing viable arguments, etc.
- · Changes word problems into mathematical terms or formulas

Use alternative methods in approaching new or unfamiliar mathematical problems

- SAS kindergarten applicants may demonstrate the following:
- Demonstrates keen awareness of quantitative information in the world around them
- · Demonstrates pattern awareness and notices regularities in their environment
- · Shows advanced understanding of size, shape, pattern, position and direction
- · Notices quantities; ability to compare quantities in real-life situations and use real and created units of measurement
- · Counts, compares and uses mathematical operations during play
- · Represents mathematical ideas with objects, pictures or numbers
- · Estimates and uses mental calculation

Use extensive vocabulary easily and accurately to express creative ideas

- · Demonstrates a vivid imagination in a variety of products
- · Shows unusual ability to express self, feelings, concepts, etc.
- Plans and selects alternative means to demonstrate creative ideas
- Demonstrates fluent, concise and creative self-expression
- · Uses a large vocabulary in primary language
- · Shows ability to "code switch" and uses language appropriate to specific disciplines, situations and audiences

APPLICANTS TO HIGHLY GIFTED MAGNET PROGRAMS

Students eligible for Highly Gifted Magnet Programs are residents of Los Angeles Unified who are identified as:

- · Highly Gifted (HG) by scoring at the 99.9 percentile rank on an Intellectual Ability assessment administered by a Los Angeles Unified designated GATE psychologist OR
- Highly Gifted Applicable (HGA) by scoring at the 99.5 to 99.8 percentile rank on an Intellectual Ability assessment administered by a Los Angeles Unified designated GATE
 psychologist

The following Highly Gifted Magnet Centers require identification:

ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS — Eagle Rock Highly Gifted (Gr. 3–6) & San Jose Highly Gifted (Gr. 2–5)

MIDDLE SCHOOL — Portola Highly Gifted (Gr. 6-8)

HIGH SCHOOL — North Hollywood Highly Gifted (Gr. 9–12)

APPLICANTS TO SCHOOLS FOR ADVANCED STUDIES (SAS)

- · Private school, independent charter and non-LAUSD applicants must obtain verification of eligibility from their school of attendance

- Affiliated Charter SAS sites do NOT participate in the SAS verification or selection process; visit GoTo.LAUSD.net to apply to an Affiliated Charter School through the Choices
 process or contact the charter SAS site directly for more information

VERIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY

LAUSD Applicants: Verification forms are **not** required for students currently enrolled in LAUSD (except LAUSD independent charter schools). Upon receipt of the application, the District will automatically review eligibility through a District verification process in January 2024. **Parents/guardians must make sure student qualifies before submitting application.**

Private School/Independent Charter/Non-LAUSD Applicants: The Verification of Eligibility form is required for Gifted Magnet Programs and SAS sites.

Homeschooled/Non-Schooled Applicants: An alternate verification process is conducted for homeschooled applicants to Gifted Magnet/SAS without a verifying organization and applicants to SAS kindergarten who are not enrolled in preschool/UTK. This verification process must be initiated by the parent/guardian prior to the Choices deadline of Friday, November 17, 2023. Please contact Gifted/Talented Programs at (213) 241-4177 or GATE@lausd.net to initiate this verification process. Late inquiries will not be accepted.

Parents/guardians may call (213) 241-4177 or email GATE@lausd.net before applying to a Gifted Magnet or SAS site to check LAUSD records for eligibility. Your choice of a Gifted Magnet or SAS site will be removed from the selection process if eligibility criteria are not met by the deadline.

PARENT/GUARDIAN'S RESPONSIBILITY

The parents/guardians of private school, independent charter and non-LAUSD students who are applying to a Gifted Magnet Program or a Schools for Advanced Studies site must follow the procedures below. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to verify that the student's current school of attendance has submitted the required verification form by Friday, November 17, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. For an applicant previously identified as gifted by LAUSD and who is currently attending a private school, independent charter or non-LAUSD school, the parent/guardian must also submit this form to confirm that the applicant is included in the District database. ALL private school, independent charter and non-LAUSD student applicants must follow the procedures below:

Requesting Verification from the Current School of Attendance:

- Visit eChoices.lausd.net to download the Verification of Eligibility (Grades 1-12) form or the Verification of Eligibility (SAS Kindergarten) form, if applicable.
- Complete the student and parent information sections, sign and date.
- · Provide the applicable form to the student's current school of attendance, giving the school permission to complete all required sections.

Submitting Verification Forms:

Once the Verification of Eligibility form has been completed by the school of attendance, school site personnel must submit the completed and signed form by Friday, November 17, 2023. The Verification of Eligibility must be emailed by the school or submitted in a sealed official school envelope. (Do not submit the form with the application.)

- I understand that I must provide the appropriate documentation for my child to attend a Gifted Magnet, Highly Gifted Magnet or SAS site or my choice of these programs will be removed from the selection process.
- I understand that re-verification is required when applying to a new school/program and upon matriculation to the next school level (e.g., from elementary to secondary).
- I understand that my child must reside within LAUSD boundaries at the time of application and while participating in the program.
- I understand that LAUSD is not responsible for lost applications or verification forms.
- I understand that I must also submit a Choices application.
