The \$2.7 million budget provides the following: 23% for seasoned consultants with national expertise who conducted a comprehensive needs assessment and are delivering services and trainings to charters throughout the project and during the summer training summit; 5% for an Infinitec subcontract; 7% for travel and local costs; 20% for training materials, meeting support and space needs throughout the project and for the summer training summit; 31% for services and sets of services designed thru identified and prioritized needs agreed upon by Stakeholder Group for direct support of students with disabilities, teachers, and staff of the 168 Charter Schools within this project and 14% for project management and indirect expenses.
