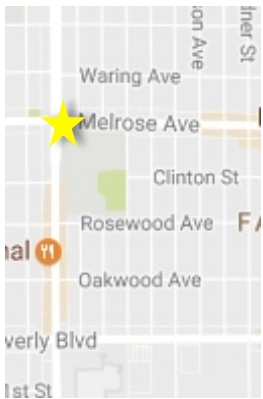


LAUSD Career and Transition Centers (CTCs) provide students with special needs, ages 18-22, individualized life skills and job training instruction. CTCs offer vocational experiences in a work environment that simulates the real world as well as providing work experiences at businesses throughout the community. CTCs emphasize the importance of developing work habits and soft skills necessary to get and keep a job, including but not limited to:

- job search instruction
- interviewing techniques
- punctuality
- good hygiene
- work stamina
- effective communication
- strong work ethics
- positive social skills
- self-advocacy skills



Students can develop public transportation travel skills, and once placed for a work experience at a business in the community, CTC Job Coaches provide supervision, instruction, and support at the worksite.



For students who are ready for the next level of independence and training the CTC West offers **Project SEARCH**; an internship program and the **WLA College CATS** programs.

Trained and experienced staff support learning experiences as students develop greater independence, work specific and work soft skills. Career and Transition Center programs work in conjunction with LAUSD's District Office of Transition Services (D.O.T.S.), the Department of Rehabilitation, and the L.A. County Regional Centers to provide students access to an array of support services that can assist them throughout their lives.
