

WHY CTC?

Students on the Alternate Curriculum deserve a post-high school experience like all other students. CTC's provide essential life and job skills in a post-high school setting. Our Job Developers track the progress of students at CTC's and provide real-world work experience for students in the community! Our Direct Hire rate surpasses state and federal employability rates for adults who have graduated from alternate curriculum programs. Our graduates are better prepared for Regional Center Programs. It is essential that students who have completed 4 years of high school transition to a CTC for necessary skills training.

CATS & PROJECT SEARCH

CATS (Center for Advanced Transition Skills) serves students ages 18-22 on the alternate curriculum. These students learn to take public transportation to and from Pierce College. They are enrolled in college classes and participate in on and off-campus work internships.

Project SEARCH serves students age 21 on the alternate curriculum. Students take MTA to and from Kaiser Permanente, Woodland HIIIs and rotate through work internships in various hospital departments. Project SEARCH has one of the highest direct hire rates for adults with disabilities in the nation!
