

Measure US: The Local Public Schools Safety and Upgrades Measure



November 5, 2024 General Election

Measure US is the \$9 billion local schools safety and upgrades measure on the November 5, 2024 general election ballot for Los Angeles Unified voters.

If approved by 55% of voters, Measure US would provide funding to:

- Improve schools for safety and earthquakes.
- Upgrade and modernize school facilities for 21st century student learning and college and career preparedness.
- Complete essential upgrades to school buildings and grounds (e.g., roofing, HVAC, plumbing, piping and paving).
- Improve access for individuals with disabilities.
- Reduce disparities in school facilities between newer and older schools to provide equitable learning environments across the District.
- Upgrade school and learning technology.
- Expand and enhance outdoor spaces and food service facilities to support the health and well-being of students.
- Improve energy efficiency in school buildings and support the transition to electrified infrastructure, including school buses, to foster sustainability and reduce environmental impacts.

Costs

- Measure US is estimated to levy an average of 2.5 cents per \$100 of assessed (not market) property value annually, generating about \$456,123,000 each year until approximately 2059.
- For a single-family residence within LAUSD boundaries at the median assessed value of \$444,269, this would equate to approximately \$111 a year or about \$9.25 a month.

Oversight and Accountability

- Measure US is subject to strict oversight and accountability.
- All proposed expenditures are reviewed by the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee and approved by the Board in public meetings.
- All expenditures are subject to annual independent financial and performance audits.
- Funds are legally restricted from being used for administrator salaries and other operating costs.



Important Election Information

- Election Day is November 5, 2024.
- The deadline to register to vote in this election is October 21.
