
BSAP Organizational Chart

Black Student Achievement Plan Definition of Success

Successful Black student achievement is defined by high academic performance, strong social-emotional awareness and management, and positive cultural identity. Furthermore, strategies and methods utilized to cultivate these things shall be directly responsive to the unique needs of Black students due in large to the historic and ongoing social and economic conditions experienced by Black people.



BSAP PAC Objectives



- Members will be able to provide feedback regarding BSAP implementation ensuring responsiveness to the needs of parents
- Members will review data aligned to the 16 indicators
- Members will be able to give input towards the LCAP goals of the BSAP PAC.





BSAP PAC Members' Responsibilities

- Assist by providing input on the educational priorities of the school based on achievement data.
- Offer perspective on a variety of school issues (school climate, social-emotional learning, special education, attendance, extracurricular activities, etc.).
- Provide feedback on culturally responsive practices in the classroom.
- Promote and encourage parent and community participation in the school.

- Provide a communication link between the school and the community.
- Help identify the concerns of students, parents, and community members and assist in developing solutions.
- Parents or guardians whose children attend the local district schools are eligible to serve as members of the BSAP parent advisory council.





Has your experience changed in school as a result of the Black Student Achievement Plan (BSAP)? 6,804 responses










Do you have access to a school site advocate? 6,787 responses











Do you have access to an adult on campus to meet with for support? 6,773 responses








Do you have access to the BSAP Counselor on your campus? 6,767 responses











Do you have access to the School Climate Advocate on your campus? 6,765 responses











Do you have access to the BSAP PSW on your campus? 6,769 responses










Are you involved in extra-curricular activities at your school (clubs, sports, band, choir, etc...) 6,776 responses



Pre-K to College and Beyond

This module will explore the power of one's mindset. You will learn what students say educators should know. We will examine what a competitively eligible student is and what skills are needed for graduation and college. Looking beyond college and postsecondary, learn what the expected skills employers will seek in the 2025 job market. Lastly, vou will learn about LAUSD's offerings and develop your own plan of action.

Language Development

This module emphasizes the importance of teaching language to your child(ren) at an early age. You will participate in activities you can do or play with your child(ren)that will incite language development. You will deepen your understanding about "home language" vs. "academic language". You will be able to walk away with activities you can apply immediately after the session. Get ready to take your child(ren)'s language development to the next level!

Literacy and Culture

This module will deepen your understanding of culturally responsive pursuits which targets identity and skill, focused on the Dr. Gholdy Muhammad's book, Cultivating Genius. You will understand how you can combine culture and literacy. You will walk away with book titles for African American literature and how to allow your child(ren) to see themselves, their identity, within the characters of the book. Your child(ren) will create their joy from the literature they read.

Math at Home

This module will minimize or remove the barrier of the fear of math. You will view math from a positive mindset as you engage in activities or games for age appropriate math skills. You will enter into a safe space for you to share your math experiences. You will understand how to engage your child(ren) in addition and multiplication games. You will deepen your knowledge of various websites for math. Lastly, you will leave with an account for your family to explore and learn various age approach math skills for Khan Academy.


