A copy of the most recent LAUSD COVID-19 Containment, Response, and Control Plan (COVID-19 Containment, Response, and Control Plan) Ensure the school is equipped with a supply of face masks and COVID-19 test kits Has the written Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP) been updated, and П the summary sheet posted in a prominent location? (https://www.lausd.org/Page/3760) Has annual training on "Injury and Illness Prevention" been provided to all staff and documented with sign-in sheets and agendas? A video resource is available on MyPLN that covers the essential content. Have all staff completed the "Bloodborne Pathogens" training through the My Professional Learning Network (MyPLN)? Are all accidents and injuries investigated within 24 hours and findings documented in ISTAR? Has the Hazard Communication Program been downloaded and made available П in the Main Office? Has staff been trained on chemical products and hazards in the workplace? (https://achieve.lausd.net/Page/2942) If you are a secondary school with a chemistry laboratory, has a Chemical Safety Coordinator (CSC) been designated and the Appointment Letter sent to OEHS by August 31st in accordance with REF-1563.5? (https://www.lausd.org/Page/2797) Has the written Heat Illness Prevention Program (HIPP) been downloaded and updated? (https://achieve.lausd.net/Page/16805) Are daily heat and air quality advisories reviewed and recommendations implemented? Advisories are e-mailed out when issued and posted on the OEHS home page (https://achieve.lausd.net/oehs) Has annual training on "Heat Illness Prevention" been provided to all staff and documented with sign-in sheets/agenda?
