


Safety Valets support a more orderly and fluid movement of vehicular traffic during the morning drop-off. The Valet Program channels drivers through a queue of traffic cones to the drop off zone, where volunteers assist students to safely exit the car. Drivers do not need to exit their vehicle in the drop-off area.

The Safety Valet, an important program of Safe Routes to School, seeks to enhance the safety of students' journey to school. Facilitating a predictable flow of vehicular traffic helps promote a calm and safe environment for all students who walk, bike, or are dropped off at school.

Valet Volunteers will:

- Open car doors.
- Greet students.
- Direct drivers to pull forward after each child has safely exited the vehicle.
- Encourage continuous flow of traffic in and around the Safety Valet drop off area.

How the Program Works

- Schools contact LAUSD's Office of Environmental Health & Safety (OEHS) at (213) 241-3199 or trafficsafety@lausd.net.
- OEHS visits the school to identify Valet locations and street sign requirements.
- LADOT installs sign types and locations.
- Schools order the Safety Valet Kit from District General Stores catalog. OEHS approves the Valet Kit purchase.
- School administrators confirm a minimum of 5 volunteers at the school.
- OEHS coordinates with School Police to train Valet volunteers at the school.
- School administrator publicizes the Valet Program to parents.
- School Police assists with implementation when the Valet program is first launched.
