Quorum was met. Meeting adjourned at 6:20 p.m.

Commission approved November minutes.

Introduced guests and new commissioners.

Commissioner expressed concerns of increase of hate crimes and bias against Muslim students and community members and recommended educational outreach to schools.

Guest recounted experience of being bullied as a Muslim student. Would like to create opportunity for positive discussions at the schools. Guest reports that 55% of Muslim students have been bullied.

Muslim Speakers Network is available as a supplement.

Visit ING.org and ADL.org to see lesson plans.

Important to PD for central office division of instruction.

Prioritize schools with high Muslim populations or the subgroup is not large enough to create a community. Urdu, Farsi, Arabic, Bengali, Bahasa are typical languages spoken by Muslims. Bell HS and Granada Hills HS have high representation of Muslims.

Fellowship of Reconciliation (FOR), Arab World Education committee does educational workshops for teachers.

Recommendation – board should advise schools to ensure safety of Muslim students and recommend educational outreach to staff and students.

MPAC – does anti-bullying outreach.

Guests will help create k-12 educational materials.

Joyce recommends ad hoc group to create an action.

Motion: Ad hoc committee has the authority from the commission to write and present a resolution to the board calling for Fostering positive intergroup relations with a focus on the Muslim community.

Approved unanimously.

Robin Toma emailed a draft resolution.

ETHNIC STUDIES UPDATE

Joyce, Gary, Michele and Karris met with Dr. Derrick Chau, Instructional Director, re: Ethnic studies and the cultural proficiency continuum.

Chau said we must consider the expenses, educational materials and professional development.

Teachers are working on updating the current classes that are already AG approved: Drafts will be presented to committee in January; due in February for UC approval Chao is aware of student protests and recognizes that teachers may be reticent to brave potential political issues.

Recommend Tools for Tolerance from MOT for Ethnic Studies Teachers. Karris cautioned against a monolithic approach to Native American studies. Julia Bogan shared a K-12 curriculum she created on Tongva.

Supported proposal to offer Day-long conference symposium at MOT in March 2016. Ad Hoc committee on the symposium: Obie, Michele, Joyce

Need to: Flesh out list of resource people and a rubric to evaluate proposed curriculum (sample given to Chau)

Ad Hoc committee on Ethnic Studies: Joyce, Allan, Samar, Michele, Karris, Gary.

Human relations award. Motion approved to direct Bud and Gary to meet with Earl Perkins to work with restorative justice on identifying noteworthy projects.
