

MAJOR CHANGES

Below are the major changes for the 2020-21 school year:

- 1. The average class size in grades 4-5(6) for non-high needs elementary schools will be reduced by 1 student.
- 2. The average class size for selected targeted high needs elementary schools in grades 4-5(6) will be reduced by 0.5 student. These schools will reach the district target class size of 27:1 for PHBAO elementary schools and 32.5:1 for Desegregated/Receiver elementary schools in FY 2020-21.

GUIDELINES

TEACHERS

The teacher staffing ratios for the 2020-21 school year will be as follows:

- 1) Grades K-3 Teacher staffing ratios will be the same as those in place for the 2019- 20 school year.
- 2) Grades 4-5(6) for non-targeted elementary schools class size will be reduced by 1 student.
- 3) Grades 4-5(6) for selected targeted high needs elementary schools class size will be reduced by 0.5 student. See Appendix 2, Attachment F for the list of selected targeted high needs elementary schools.
- For Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) reporting purposes, enumerated below is the determination of the funding or program code to be used for the norm teacher resources generated by the following norm tables:
 - Appendix 1 Various norm tables for Non-High Needs Schools Class Size Reduction by 1 student in grades 4-5(6)
 - Appendix 2 Various norm tables for selected Targeted High Needs Schools Class Size Reduction by 0.5 students in grades 4-5(6)
 - Appendix 3 Various norm tables for the 2017-18 Class Size for all Schools (Base)



- The norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-5(6) in Appendix 3 (Attachments A to D) will be allocated in program code 13027 (General Fund School Program) or program code 11119 (Dual/Foreign Language/Bilingual).
- The difference between the norm teacher resources generated using the staffing ratios in Appendix 1 (Attachments A to D) and the norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-5(6) in Appendix 3 (Attachments A to D) will be allocated in program code 10989 (TSP-CSR Teacher/Librarian).
- The difference between the norm teacher resources generated using the staffing ratios in Appendix 2 (Attachments A to D) and the norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-5(6) in Appendix 3 (Attachment A to D) will be allocated in program code 10989 (TSP-CSR Teacher/Librarian).
- Dual Language Program (Dual Language Two-Way Immersion, Dual Language One-Way Immersion, and World Language Immersion Programs):

Grades K-3 will receive the norm teacher resources based on a 24:1 student teacher ratio in each program language. Grades 4-5/6 will also be normed separately and will receive the norm teacher resources based on the applicable norm table for Grades 4-5(6).

In addition, a new cost center will be established for each newly approved elementary program language in 2020-21 school year (e.g., Spanish, Korean, Mandarin, Arabic, Armenian, French, etc.) to facilitate the collection and validation of enrollment counts.

Norm teacher resources for Dual Language Program using the 2017-18 staffing ratios in Appendix 3 will be allocated in program code 11119 (Dual/Foreign Language/Bilingual) the CSR teachers generated using norm tables in Appendix 1 or Appendix 2 will be allocated in program 10989.

- Norm Enrollment Adjustments As in the past, the following adjustments will be applied to Norm Day Enrollment for the 2020-21 school year:
 - Age ineligible students who are:
 - enrolled as Kindergarten (K) or Transitional Kindergarten (TK) but turn 5
 years old after December 2, 2020, or
 - enrolled as grade TE but turn 5 years old after June 30, 2021



- Students with more than one enrollment record
- No Show students (students who are scheduled into classes but have not attended school, i.e., marked absent each day) who were not flagged by the school in MiSiS as No Show by Norm Day data capture will be manually deducted from the school's Norm Day enrollment count.
- Only enrolled students with scheduled classes in MiSiS will be counted. In other words, students must be both enrolled and scheduled for norm purposes. Schools should ensure that every enrolled student's class schedule is entered into MiSiS. Otherwise, enrolled students without scheduled classes will be excluded from Norm Day Enrollment count.
- In addition to ensuring that students are both enrolled and scheduled in MiSiS, school must also ensure that students are enrolled in the Appropriate cost center (i.e., home school versus magnet center or dual language center). Students approved to be enrolled at the magnet center must be enrolled at the magnet center's cost center, unless documentation exists to rescind magnet placement. School staff must correct all enrollment errors, including incorrect cost center and class(es), before enrollment counts are captured for norm day, September 18, 2020.
- Special Day Program (SDP) students at Elementary Schools: Students enrolled in the class/section of a Special education teacher are categorized in the Classification Report as SDP. The total SDP counts are excluded in the calculation of General education norm teachers.
- Special education teachers are assigned to elementary schools based on the number of students with special needs and their specific disabilities. Refer to Attachment E for the Special Education norm table guide. The class sizes in the norm table guide are based on the Los Angeles Unified School District and United Teachers Los Angeles Collective Bargaining Agreement.
- Pursuant to Education Code section 42238.02, as a condition of receiving a grade span adjustment for kindergarten through grade three (K-3 GSA), a component of Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), school districts must make progress towards or maintain a K-3 maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site. If the annual independent audit of a school district shows that a school district did not comply with these conditions, the California Department of Education (CDE) will retroactively reduce the school district's funding.



 The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten, 32 in grades 1-3 at any time, and 36 in grades 4-6.

Note: These limits also apply to "combination" classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the District because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.

• Staffing Position Simulator

"Staffing Position Simulator" tool is available on the School Fiscal Services website (http://achieve.lausd.net/Page/794). The purpose of this tool is to provide schools with transparency as to how Norm Teacher counts are calculated based on their enrollment, Norm Category, and Affiliated Charter status. In addition to the Norm Teacher count, this tool will also calculate the number of Counselor, Administrator, and Clerical norm positions. Schools can also use the tool to assist with the norm calculation during the budget planning and development.

 After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For teachers, new positions will be established based on enrollment growth, or existing positions will be closed based on enrollment decline.

The following are the Class Size and Norm Table information for different norm categories for Grades K-5/6. Average Class Size without K-3 Grade Span Adjustment Funding.

Norm Tables -

- a. Schools identified as PHBAO, use Attachment A, Table 1P; schools identified as Desegregated/Receiver, use Attachment B, Table 1D; schools identified as PHBAO Affiliated Charter, use Attachment C, 1PA; and schools identified as Desegregated/Receiver Affiliated Charter, use Attachment D, 1DA. All tables are based on a maximum class size of 24:1.
- b. School identified as PHBAO Affiliated Charter Schools, use Attachment C, Table 1PA, 1PAA and 1PAB. Table 1PA is the number of teachers needed for a student teacher ratio of 24:1. Table 1PAA (TIIG PHBAO) is the number of teachers needed for a student teacher ratio 29.5:1. Table 1PAB (District Norm) is the number of teachers needed for a student teacher ratio of 32:1.
 - K-3 Class Size Reduction resources are used to fund the difference between the number of teachers generated from the TIIG PHBAO Norm Table (1PAA) and the PHBAO K-3 Norm Table (1PA).
 - TIIG class size reduction resources are used to fund the difference between the number of teachers generated from the District Norm Table (1PAB) and the TIIG PHBAO Norm Table (1PAA).
- c. School identified as Desegregated/Receiver Affiliated Charter Schools, use Attachment D, Tables 1DA and Table 1DAB. Table 1DA is the number of teachers needed for a student teacher ratio of 24:1. Table 1DAB (District Norm) is the number of teachers needed for a student teacher ratio of 32:1.
 - K-3 Class Size Reduction resources are used to fund the difference between the number of teachers generated from Table 1DAB (District Norm) and Table 1DA (K-3 Norm Table).



The number of norm teachers for grades K-3 at PHBAO Affiliated Charter Schools that began operations prior to fiscal year 2013-14 will be calculated as follows:

- I. Determine the number of teacher positions based on K-3 enrollment from Table 1PA.
- II. Determine the number of teacher positions based on K-3 enrollment from Table 1PAA.
- III. Determine the number of teacher positions based on K-3 enrollment from Table 1PAB.
- IV. Subtract the number of teacher positions in Step III from Step II to determine the TIIG funded class size reduction positions. Affiliated Charter schools that began operation before 2013-2014 will use the Charter School Categorical Block Grant to fund the number of positions calculated in this step.
- V. Subtract the number of teacher positions in Step II from Step I to determine the K-3 CSR funded positions.

Grades 4-5(6)²

Norm Tables -

- a) Schools identified as PHBAO, use Attachment A, Table 2P; schools identified as Desegregated/Receiver use Attachment B, Table 2D. Schools identified as PHBAO Affiliated Charter Schools use Attachment C, Table 2PA; schools identified as Desegregated/Receiver Affiliated Charter Schools use Attachment D, Table 2DA.
- b) These norms provide an average class size of 28.5 pupils for PHBAO schools, an average class size of 34.0 for Desegregated/Receiver schools, and an average class size of 37.0 (District norm) for Affiliated Charter Schools, based on grades 4-5/(6) norm day enrollment.
- c) Affiliated Charter schools that began operations prior to fiscal year 2013-14 will use the Charter School Categorical Block Grant to implement Grades 4-5(6) class size reduction (28.5:1 for affiliated charter schools identified as PHBAO or 34:1 for affiliated charter schools identified as Desegregated/Receiver).



To calculate the number of positions for a student teacher ratio of 28.5:1 (PHBAO):

- I. Determine the number of teacher positions based on grades 4-5(6) enrollment from Table 2P.
- II. Determine the number of teacher positions based on grades 4-5(6) enrollment from Table 2PA.
- III. Subtract the number of teacher positions in Step II from Step I to determine the TIIG funded class size reduction positions. Affiliated Charter schools that began operation before 2013-2014 will use the Charter School Categorical Block Grant to fund the number of positions calculated in this step.

To calculate the number of positions for a student teacher ratio of 34:1 Desegregated/Receiver):

- I. Determine the number of teacher positions based on grades 4-5(6) enrollment from Table 2D.
- II. Determine the number of teacher positions based on grades 4-5(6) enrollment from Table 2DA.
- III. Subtract the number of teacher positions in Step II from Step I to determine the TIIG funded class size reduction positions. Affiliated Charter schools that began operation before 2013-2014 will use the Charter School Categorical Block Grant to fund the number of positions calculated in this step.

^{1.2}Continuing for the 2020-21 fiscal year, funding for Targeted Instructional Improvement Block Grant (TIIG) resources for Affiliated Charter Schools that began operations prior to fiscal year 2013-14 is included in the Charter School Categorical Block Grant. Therefore, these Affiliated Charter Schools are not eligible for class size reduction funded by District TIIG resources (PHBAO or Desegregated/Receiver). Norm Charts displayed in Attachment C and D.

However, Affiliated Charter Schools that started operations in fiscal year 2013-14 and beyond do not receive Charter School Categorical Block Grant allocations. Instead, these schools are eligible for class size reduction funded by District TIIG resources (PHBAO or Desegregated/Receiver).



ADMINISTRATORS

- The Administrator staffing will be the same as those in place for the 2019-20 school year.
- Administrative personnel are allocated based on total school enrollment, including transitional kindergarten expansion, special day program classes (SDP), state preschool (SPS), prekindergarten special education, magnet center, and dual language center enrollment.
- The Assistant Principal positions will be allocated in program code 10552 (TSP-Student Equity Needs Index).
- After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For administrators, growth positions are allocated but reductions are not implemented.

 The allocation of norm administrative position(s) for Span Schools will be based on the total school enrollment, including transitional kindergarten expansion, special day program classes (SDP), state preschool (SPS), pre-kindergarten special education, magnet center, and dual language center enrollment using the Middle/Senior High School Administrative Staffing table.



CLERICAL

- The clerical staffing will be the same as those in place for the 2019-20 school year.
- Each school receives the number of clerical positions using the staffing tables displayed below, based on active enrollment, including transitional kindergarten expansion program, special day program students (SDP), pre-kindergarten special day classes, magnet center, and dual language center enrollment. Additional clerical resources to support State Pre-School classes are allocated separately by the Early Childhood Education Division.
- Starting in 2020-21 fiscal year, the Modified Consent Decree clerical position has been changed to "Special Education Clerical Support".
- Sites do not have flexibility over Special Education Clerical position.
- After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For clerical support, growth positions are allocated but reductions are not implemented.

Clerical Staffing pattern

- The typical staffing pattern at elementary school is as follows:
 - One (1) School Administrative Assistant (Job ID 24102500)
 - All other clerical positions Office Technician(s) (Job ID 24102828)

Span School Clerical Calculation

Span school clerical norm allocation is based on the following (weighted average):

- 1. Determine the percentage enrollment by grade level groupings K-5 and 6-12 to total enrollment.
- 2. Determine number of clerical positions from the individual clerical staffing tables based on 100% of enrollment as if site is an elementary school and again based on 100% of enrollment as if site is a secondary school.
- 3. Multiply the percentage enrollment by grade level groupings from #1 above by the number of positions that result from the individual clerical staffing tables from #2 above.
- 4. Sum the result. If the result is greater than 2.0, round to the nearest full FTE (e.g. 2.49 FTE is rounded to 2.0; 2.50 FTE is rounded to 3.0 FTE). If the result is less than or equal to 2.0 FTE, the site will be allocated 2.0 FTE clerical staff.



The 2020-21 norm tables provide one position for every 24 students based on total enrollment in grades K-3 classes. To prevent loss of Local Control Funding Formula K through 3 Grade Span Adjustment funding, the school district must maintain a maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site.

A class with 4th, 5th, or 6th grade students combined with any K-3 students is considered a K-3 class. Therefore, maximum average class size is 24. Attendance & Enrollment Section captures school month end enrollments for compliance with K-3 class size guidelines and will work with Local District in monitoring of class sizes.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten and 32 in grades 1-3.

Note: These limits also apply to "combination" classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the District because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.




