



# MAGNET SCHOOLS AND CENTERS STAFFING RATIOS FOR 2020-21 SEPTEMBER 2020

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## **MAJOR CHANGES**

Below are the major changes for the 2020-21 school year:

1. The average class size in grades 4-5(6) for non-high needs elementary magnet centers and schools will be reduced by 1 student.
2. The average class size in grades 4-5(6) for selected targeted high needs PHBAO elementary magnet centers and schools will be reduced by 0.5 students. These schools will reach the district target class size of 27:1 in FY 2020-21. The average class size in grades 4-5(6) for all other selected targeted high needs elementary magnet centers and schools will be reduced by 1 student. See Appendix 2, Attachment G for the list of targeted high needs elementary schools.
3. The average class size in grades 6-8 for all middle magnet centers and schools will be reduced by 1 student. See Appendix 2, Attachment G for the list of targeted high needs middle schools.
4. The average class size in grades 9-12 for all senior magnet centers and schools will be reduced by 1 student.

## **GUIDELINES**

### **TEACHERS**

- The teacher staffing ratios for grades K-3 will be the same as those in place for the 2019-20 school year.
- For Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) reporting purposes, enumerated below is the determination of the funding or program code to be used for the norm teacher resources generated by the following norm tables:

Appendix 1 – Various norm tables for class size reduction by 1 student in grades 4-12 for non-high needs magnet schools and magnet centers.

Appendix 2 – Various norm tables for class size reduction by .05 student in grades 4-5(6) for selected targeted high needs PHBAO elementary magnet schools and magnet centers, class size reduction by 1 student in grades 4-5(6) for all other high needs elementary magnet schools and magnet centers; and class size reduction by 1 student in grades 6-8 for selected high needs middle magnet schools and centers.

Appendix 3 – Various norm tables for the 2017-18 Class Size for all Schools (Base)



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- a) The norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-12 in Appendix 3 (Attachments A - D) will be allocated in program code 13027 (General Fund School Program).
- b) The difference between the norm teacher resources generated using the staffing ratios reduced in Appendix 1 (Attachments A -D) and the norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-12 in Appendix 3 (Attachments A and B) will be allocated in program code 10989 (TSP-CSR Teacher/Librarian).
- c) The difference between the norm teacher resources generated using the staffing ratios in Appendix 2 (Attachments A - D) and the norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-8 in Appendix 3 (Attachment A and B) will be allocated in program code 10989 (TSP-CSR Teacher/Librarian).
- Norm Enrollment Adjustments - As in the past, the following adjustments will be applied to Norm Day Enrollment for the 2020-21 school year:
  - Age ineligible students who are:
    - enrolled as Kindergarten (K) or Transitional Kindergarten (TK) but turn 5 years old after December 2, 2020, or
    - enrolled as grade TE but turn 5 years old after June 30, 2021
  - Students with more than one enrollment record (duplicate students)
  - Students enrolled in one course only

The classification report provides counts of students with scheduled class(es) in their school of enrollment. For norm purposes, the classification report counts will be reduced to count only those students who are scheduled in two or more credit-bearing courses. Therefore, school should ensure that each student's complete schedule is entered into MiSiS in time for the Norm capture. Refer to Attachment F for the list of non-credit bearing/zero credit courses.

  - No Show students (students who are scheduled into classes but have not attended school, i.e., marked absent each day) who were not flagged by the schools in MiSiS as No Show by Norm Day data capture will be manually deducted from the school's enrollment count.



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- The SDP counts are modified when section assignments for students differed than what was called for in the Individualized Education Programs (IEPs).
- Special Day Program (SDP) students at Elementary School

Students enrolled in the class/section of a Special education teacher are categorized in the Classification Report as SDP. The total SDP counts are excluded in the calculation of general education norm teachers.

Special education teachers are assigned to elementary schools based on the number of students with special needs and their specific disabilities. Refer to Attachment E for the Special Education norm table guide. These class sizes are based on the Los Angeles Unified School District and United Teachers Los Angeles Collective Bargaining Agreement.

- Secondary SDP Student Count

Secondary students with an active Individualized Education Program (IEP) where the Percent Time in Special Ed is 50% or more are counted as SDP in the Classification Report. Moreover, SDP counts are modified when section assignments for students differed than what was called for in the IEPs.

The total SDP counts are excluded in the calculation of General education norm teachers. Special education teachers are assigned to middle and senior high schools based on the number of students with special needs and their specific disabilities. Refer to Attachment E for the Special Education norm table guide. These class sizes are based on the Los Angeles Unified School District and United Teachers Los Angeles Collective Bargaining Agreement.

- Pursuant to Education Code section 42238.02, as a condition of receiving a grade span adjustment for kindergarten through grade three (K–3 GSA), a component of Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), school districts must make progress towards or maintain a K–3 maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site. If the annual independent audit of a school district shows that a school district did not comply with these conditions, the California Department of Education (CDE) will retroactively reduce the school district's funding.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten, 32 in grades 1-3 at any time, and 36 in grades 4-6.



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Note: These limits also apply to “combination” classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the District because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.

## Staffing Position Simulator

“Staffing Position Simulator” tool is available on the School Fiscal Services website (<http://achieve.lausd.net/Page/794>). The purpose of this tool is to provide schools with transparency as to how Norm Teacher counts are calculated based on their enrollment, Norm Category, and Affiliated Charter status. In addition to the Norm Teacher count, this tool will also calculate the number of Counselor, Administrator, and Clerical norm positions. Schools can also use the tool to assist with the norm calculation during the budget planning and development.

After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For teachers, new positions will be established based on enrollment growth, or existing positions will be closed based on enrollment decline.

FY 2020-21 norm tables for different norm categories reflected on Attachment A and B are based on total school enrollment, excluding elementary students categorized as SDP in the Classification Report and secondary students with an active IEP where the Percent Time in Special Ed is 50% or more.

- A. Magnet Centers identified as Predominantly Hispanic, Black, Asian and Other Non-Anglo Students (PHBAO) use Attachment A to determine teacher allocations.
- B. Magnet Centers identified as Desegregated/Receiver use Attachment B to determine teacher allocations.
- C. Magnet Schools identified as Predominantly Hispanic, Black, Asian and Other Non-Anglo Students (PHBAO) use Attachment C to determine teacher allocations.
- D. Magnet Schools identified as Desegregated/Receiver use Attachment D to determine teacher allocations.
- E. Double Block English Courses for grades 6-8 (Attachment C, Table 5P and Attachment D, Table 5D) and Double Block English Courses for 9th grade (Attachment C, Table 6P and Attachment D, Table 6D).



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## **ADMINISTRATORS**

Starting 2019-20 fiscal year, the minimum range in the elementary school administrative staffing table is reduced from 1,110 to 1,000. Hence, the second administrative norm position (Assistant Principal, Elementary) is allocated to schools with enrollment of 1,000 and above. Moreover, the minimum range in the middle and senior high school administrative staffing table is reduced from 800 to 700. Hence, the second administrative norm position (Assistant Principal, Secondary Counseling Services) will be allocated to schools with enrollment of 700 and above.

After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For administrators, growth positions are allocated but reductions are not implemented.

## **Elementary Magnet Schools**

Administrative personnel are allocated based on total school enrollment, including Transitional Kindergarten Expansion program, special day program classes (SDP), state preschool (SPS), pre-kindergarten special education, magnet center, and dual language center enrollment.

The Generic Assistant Principal and Assistant Principal Secondary Counseling Services positions will be allocated in program code 10552 (TSP-Per Pupil School Allocation).

## **Secondary Magnet Schools**

Administrative personnel are allocated based on total school enrollment, including special day program classes (SDP) and magnet center enrollment.

The Generic Assistant Principal and Assistant Principal Secondary Counseling Services positions will be allocated in program code 10552 (TSP-Student Equity Needs Index).

- The allocation of norm administrative position(s) for Span Schools will be based on the total school enrollment, including transitional kindergarten expansion, special day program classes (SDP), state preschool (SPS), pre-kindergarten special education, magnet center, and dual language center enrollment using the Middle/Senior High School Administrative Staffing table.

### **COUNSELORS**

The counselor staffing ranges will be the same as those in place for the 2019-20 school year.

The counselors at secondary schools (grades 6-12) will be allocated in program 10529 "TSP-Nurses/HS Counselors".

After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For counselors, new positions will be established based on enrollment growth, or existing positions will be closed based on enrollment decline.

### **Middle Magnet Schools**

PHBAO middle schools should use Table A and their school-wide enrollment, including special day program classes (SDP) and magnet center enrollment, to determine the number of counseling positions they will receive.

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## Span School Counselor Calculation

- Span school counselor norm allocation is based on the following (weighted average):
  1. Determine the percentage enrollment by grade level groupings 6-8 and 9-12 to total enrollment.
  2. Determine number of counselor norm positions from the individual norm tables based on enrollment in grades 6-12 as if the site is a middle school and again based on enrollment in grades 6-12 as if the site is a senior high school.
  3. Multiply the percentage enrollment by grade level groupings from #1 above by the number of positions that result from the individual norm tables from #2 above.
  4. Sum the result. If the result is greater than 0.5, round to the nearest full FTE (e.g. 2.49 FTE is rounded to 2.0 FTE; 2.50 FTE is rounded to 3.0 FTE). If the result is less than or equal to 0.5, site will be allocated 0.5 FTE counselor.

## CLERICAL

The clerical staffing ranges will be the same as those in place for the 2019-20 fiscal year. Schools will no longer receive partial FTE (full-time equivalent) in the total norm allocation.

## Elementary, Middle and Senior High Magnet Schools

- Each school receives the number of clerical positions using the staffing tables displayed below, based on active enrollment, including transitional kindergarten expansion program, special day program students (SDP), pre-kindergarten special day classes, magnet center, and dual language center enrollment. Additional clerical resources to support State Pre-School classes are allocated separately by the Early Childhood Education Division.
- Starting in 2020-21 fiscal year, the Modified Consent Decree clerical position has been changed to "Special Education Clerical Support".
- Sites do not have flexibility over Special Education Clerical Support position.
- After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For clerical support, growth positions are allocated but reductions are not implemented.

## Span School Clerical Calculation

- Span school clerical norm allocation is based on the following (weighted average):
  - Determine the percentage enrollment by grade level groupings K-5 and 6-12 to total enrollment.
  - Determine number of clerical norm positions from the individual norm tables based on 100% of enrollment as if site is an elementary school and again based on 100% of enrollment as if site is a secondary school.
  - Multiply the percentage enrollment by grade level groupings from #1 above by the number of positions that result from the individual norm tables from #2 above.
  - Sum the result. If the result is greater than 2.0, round to the nearest full FTE (e.g. 2.49 FTE is rounded to 2.0 FTE; 2.50 FTE is rounded to 3.0 FTE). If the result is less than or equal to 2.0 FTE, the site will be allocated 2.0 FTE clerical staff.

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### **APPENDIX 1 – NORM TABLES FOR NON-HIGH NEEDS SCHOOLS**

#### **ATTACHMENT A – Teacher Norm Tables for Magnet Centers designated as PHBAO - (Magnet II)**

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The 2020-21 norm table provides one position for every 24 students based on total enrollment in grades K-3 classes. To prevent loss of Local Control Funding Formula K through 3 Grade Span Adjustment funding, the school district must maintain a maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site.

A class with 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, or 6<sup>th</sup> grade students combined with any K-3 students is considered a K-3 class. Therefore, maximum average class size is 24. Attendance & Enrollment Section captures school month end enrollments for compliance with K-3 class size guidelines and will work with Local District in monitoring of class sizes.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten and 32 in grades 1-3.

Note: These limits also apply to “combination” classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the District because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.

For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the District because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.

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The 2020-21 norm table provides one position for every 24 students based on total enrollment in grades K-3 classes. To prevent loss of Local Control Funding Formula K through 3 Grade Span Adjustment funding, the school district must maintain a maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site.

A class with 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, or 6<sup>th</sup> grade students combined with any K-3 students is considered a K-3 class. Therefore, maximum average class size is 24. Attendance & Enrollment Section captures school month end enrollments for compliance with K-3 class size guidelines and will work with Local District in monitoring of class sizes.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten and 32 in grades 1-3.

Note: These limits also apply to “combination” classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the District because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.

#### **ATTACHMENT D – Teacher Norm Tables for Magnet Schools designated as Desegregated/Receiver (Magnet I)**

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The 2020-21 norm table provides one position for every 24 students based on total enrollment in grades K-3 classes. To prevent loss of Local Control Funding Formula K through 3 Grade Span Adjustment funding, the school district must maintain a maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site.

A class with 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, or 6<sup>th</sup> grade students combined with any K-3 students is considered a K-3 class. Therefore, maximum average class size is 24. Attendance & Enrollment Section captures school month end enrollments for compliance with K-3 class size guidelines and will work with Local District in monitoring of class sizes.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten and 32 in grades 1-3.

Note: These limits also apply to “combination” classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the District because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.
