As part of the Teacher Leader Network, participants have the opportunity to establish professional growth goals that pertain to instructional design. These goals are informed and enhanced by two frameworks: The 2016 International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Standards for Students and the K-12 Computer Science Framework. Teacher Leaders participate in a series of learning sessions to reflect upon and refine their practices in order to accomplish their self-selected goals. Each session provides participants an opportunity to engage as learners exploring instructional practices that will empower them to provide personalized learning experiences as well as share their learnings with others.
