

Accommodations in an IEP may include:

For homework assignments:

- reducing homework load
- allowing students to dictate their answers
- allowing typewritten work
- allowing extended time to complete assignments

For mathematics:

- allowing students the use of a calculator or graph paper
- teacher breaking assignments into smaller steps

For reading may include:

- access to audiobooks and text-to-speech software
- the teacher not calling on a student with Dyslexia to participate in oral reading, unless the student volunteers
- allowing extra time to complete reading assignments

For spelling:

- the teacher reducing the number of items on spelling lists
- providing access to spell-check and word prediction software, and not deducting points for spelling errors

For testing:

- providing students with Dyslexia with extra time
- allowing students to give answers orally
- providing a quiet testing area

For writing may include:

- providing a student with a scribe
- providing access to speech-to-text software
- offering written or digital copies of notes
- minimizing the need to copy from the board
- providing graphic organizers
