#### HISTORY INQUIRY ESSENTIAL QUESTION:

How do places grow and change?

#### FOCUS QUESTION:

How will the history of Mediana City be commemorated?

#### **Objectives:**

- Student will design a commemoration of a significant part of the history of Mediana City to be placed in the new park.
- Students will apply for a permit to place their monument in the new park.

#### Lesson Overview:

As required by the Orange Grower's Association, students will work in their Project Design Teams to design a commemoration (plaque, monument, statue, mural, etc.) to honor the history of Mediana City. Students will then apply for a permit to place their monument in the new park.
