<u>Audition Dates:</u> 3rd Saturday in November and 3rd Saturday in May

DANCE Student will not be allowed to participate if attire is not appropriate.

- Student participates in a warm-up.
- Prepare a one-minute, ageappropriate dance to music that is selected and prepared prior to the audition. Student should bring a device (charged or with fresh batteries) with music cued to the starting point. No streaming of music allowed. Dance style and musical choices are open and must be age-appropriate

(e.g., ballet, tap, hip hop, etc.).

- Perform a short dance improvisation.
- Perform a short sequence of choreographed movements, if necessary.
- Student should wear appropriate dance clothing (no costumes, big shirts, jeans, or oversized sweats).
 Students may wear black and white leotards, tights, t-shirts, sweats and

appropriate dance shoes or bare feet. Long hair should be tied back or pinned up neatly.

<u>DRAMA</u> No costumes. Comfortable clothing is recommended.

- Student prepares presentation which may be a memorized 15–30 line <u>age-appropriate</u> monologue or acting routine from a play of your choice (Max. 2 min.); no profanity.
- Student should be prepared to give a cold reading or an improvisation on a piece assigned by the evaluator at the audition.

VOICE Student should bring either sheet music for an accompanist (or their own accompanist) or a device with music <u>only</u> as an accompaniment (charged or with fresh batteries) with music cued to the starting point. No streaming of music allowed. **Selection must be age-**

appropriate.

- Be prepared to sing one verse and chorus of an age- appropriate song selected and prepared prior to the audition. (Singing a song a capella is not recommended.)
- Listen to and sing back intervals

and rhythms played on the piano.

 Sing a song taught by the evaluator at the audition.

Conduct During Assessment:

Students displaying unacceptable behavior will be asked to leave.

Contact School of Attendance to Start Paperwork

- Students must attend LAUSD schools and reside within LAUSD boundaries.
- All Charter Schools within LAUSD boundaries must contact the Charter Schools Division to request the Fee-for-Service Form and submit it with the application in order for students to participate.
- School initiates the referral in MiSiS and submits student paperwork four weeks prior to audition date.

- A. Apply online at apply.lausd.net,
 - Print the School Verification Form and have it signed by the principal;
 - Print and complete the emergency information form. Return both forms to the GATE office by the end of the first week in September **or**
- B. Contact the LAUSD school of attendance and request the Conservatory application issued late July/early August and the emergency information form

 Return the signed application with the Student Emergency Information form to the GATE office by the end of the first week in September

The Saturday Conservatory of Fine Arts begins in October and ends in April. Selected qualifying students will be invited by letter, which must be presented at registration.

- Students identified gifted in the performing arts category (new and returning) will have enrollment priority.
- Returning students have continuous enrollment.
- Classes are standards-based.



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
