POWER WORDS AND QUIZZES

Not all articles contain Power Words and/or quizzes. The Power Words activity is identified on an article as a lightning bolt; Quizzes are identified as light bulbs. Notice the article, "College Kids Help Meals on Wheels," shows both a light bulb (Quiz) and lightning bolt (Power Words). The two other articles only offer quizzes.

Power Words and Quizzes for the article are located under a right tab, 'Activities.' This is where you can preview these materials for your students, especially if you want to provide specific instructions before assigning the reading.



Power Words are Tier-2 vocabulary terms that appear in bold green within the article. Click on the Power Word to read or hear a definition.



You will find a low-stakes Power Words quiz under 'Activities.' By participating in this activity, students practice using these vocabulary terms in a variety of contexts.

ANNOTATIONS

Students can highlight text and annotate thoughts by right clicking and highlighting wherever they want in the text. A pop-up bar appears to the right that allows them to choose their highlight color, make notes, and share. The teacher can review these annotation and post questions and/or comments to the students.
