Define and Approve Four School Cafeteria Upgrade Projects and Amend the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan to Incorporate Therein November 15, 2022

**Facilities Services Division and Food Services Division** 

#### **Action Proposed:**

Define and approve four school cafeteria upgrade projects to modernize food serving lines at Franklin High School, Griffith STEAM Magnet Middle School, Carnegie Middle School and Carson High School, and amend the Facilities Services Division (Facilities) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to incorporate therein. The total combined budget for the four projects is \$4,892,610 (Attachment A).

Authorize the Chief Procurement Officer and/or the Chief Facilities Executive and/or their designee(s) to execute all instruments necessary, as legally permissible, to implement the proposed projects, including budget modifications and the purchase of equipment and materials.

### **Background:**

On August 24, 2021, the Board of Education (Board) adopted an update to the School Upgrade Program (SUP) to integrate Measure RR funding and priorities into its operational framework and approved the Measure RR Implementation Plan (Implementation Plan) to help guide the identification of sites and development of project proposals (Board Report No. 027-21/22). The Implementation Plan included the development of school cafeteria upgrade projects to install Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) systems in cafeteria kitchens, upgrade Cafeteria Management Systems, and modernize cafeteria serving lines.

Staff's proposal aligns with these priorities. The school cafeteria upgrade projects will modernize serving lines to current standards with additional self-service lines to streamline the distribution of student meals. The work to be undertaken at each school includes, but is not limited to:

- Remove obsolete serving lines.
- Purchase and install new up-to-date energy efficient equipment of a permanent nature, including refrigerated merchandiser, heated merchandiser, hot food cabinet, merchandiser rack, mobile cashier stand, secondary mobile counter, reach-in refrigerator, retractable belt post.
- Provide electrical upgrades to support the new equipment, and any other required improvements or mitigations to ensure compliance with local, state, and/or federal facilities requirements.

#### **Expected Outcomes:**

Staff anticipates the Board of Education will define and approve four school cafeteria upgrade projects and amend the Facilities SEP to incorporate therein. Approval will authorize staff to proceed with the implementation of the proposed projects to improve working conditions for employees and streamline the distribution of student meals.

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#### **Board Options and Consequences:**

Adoption of the proposed action will authorize staff to proceed with the expenditure of Bond Program funds to implement the proposed projects. If staff's proposal is not approved, Bond funds will not be expended, and school cafeteria needs will remain unaddressed.

#### **Policy Implications:**

The proposal is consistent with the Los Angeles Unified's long-term goal to address unmet school facilities needs and significantly improve the conditions of aging and deteriorating school facilities as described in Los Angeles Unified local bond measures.

## **Budget Impact:**

The total combined budget for the four projects is \$4,892,610. The projects will be funded with Bond Program funds earmarked specifically for school cafeteria upgrades.

Each project budget was prepared based on the current information known and assumptions about the project scope, site conditions, and market conditions. Individual project budgets will be reviewed throughout the planning, design, and construction phases as new information becomes known or unforeseen conditions arise and will be adjusted accordingly to enable the successful completion of each project.

#### **Student Impact:**

The proposed school cafeteria upgrade projects will modernize serving lines to current standards with additional self-service lines to help provide nutritional meals and improve student health, safety, and educational quality for approximately 4,794 students.

#### **Issues and Analysis:**

The proposed projects were identified by the Food Services Division in consultation with Local District, school site administrators and Facilities staff. Recipient school sites are secondary schools that did not receive cafeteria upgrades through previous Café LA serving line upgrade efforts and/or other Board-approved projects (e.g., newly built schools, campus modernizations). Projects are prioritized based on enrollment.

As necessary, the Office of Environmental Health and Safety (OEHS) will evaluate the proposed projects in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to ensure compliance. If through the planning and design process it is determined that the proposed project scope(s) will not sufficiently address the identified needs, the project scope, schedule and budget will be revised accordingly.

### **Bond Oversight Committee Recommendations:**

This item was considered by the School Construction Bond Citizen's Oversight Committee (BOC) at its meeting on September 29, 2022. Staff has concluded that this proposed Facilities SEP amendment is in alignment with BOC recommendations and will facilitate Los Angeles Unified's ability to successfully implement the Facilities SEP.
