

RADIO TEST CHECKLIST: BASE SCHOOLS

	Check the Emergency Radio Communications Tree to see if any of your Reporting
	schools have changed.
	Set radio to Channel 1 for emergency communications with yReporting schools.
	Ensure you are located where you can hear the radio clearly and have your list of
	assigned Reporting schools handy.
	PAUSE before speaking to ensure the following:
	Press the talk button before speaking.
	Allow the radio system time to be ready to transmit message.
	Understand that there is only one transmission at a time on the radio; wait your turn and don't interrupt.
	Speak after planning your message and organizing your thoughts.
	End transmission (lift finger from talk button) and listen for acknowledgment of your message.
	Begin your radio test by announcing your school name and which Reporting school you
	are calling, "Xavier High School to 1st Street Elementary. What are your damages and
	injuries?"
	Acknowledge the Reporting school's message by repeating it back, "1st Elementary, this
	is Xavier High School, confirming x damages and x injuries."
	If you do not hear a Reporting school response, telephone the Reporting school to
	request that they participate in the radio test.
	Conduct a second roll call with any Reporting schools that did not respond to the first radio test attempt.
	After completing Phase 1 of the test with your reporting schools, change the radio to
	channel 2 to prepare for Phase 2 with LASPD.
	Listen for your school name to be announced over the radio by LASPD, in alphabetical
	order.
	Reply in the Phase 1 format, stating your school name and damage/injury status and
	school name and status of each Reporting school.
	Following the test, complete a Radio Test Evaluation to document your experiences at
	lausd.org/edrilleval.
	Submit a Radio Repair Form if any transmission issues are noted lausd ora radio
