Parent Center Activities Revisions

A parent center will be established at the school to provide parent training and education as an ongoing practice. The Parent Center Director at ES#10 will be a pivotal contact for parents in the school community and will work with the Parent Center Director at Sutter MS to coordinate services for families with children in both schools. Additionally, the Parent Center Director will coordinate with the LD1 Parent Facilitator and Organization Facilitator to identify community services and resources within existing community partnerships for families in need.

The school will provide ongoing parent education classes and workshops on topics identified by the focus group parents and on-going parent surveys. These classes and workshops will be sponsored and/or presented by school site personnel, Local District personnel, and wrap around services through community agencies and organizations such as Youth Policy Institute, and Northridge and Kaiser Hospitals.
