School Culture

Western Avenue School is a school where students, staff, parents, and community members experience a positive, safe, and rigorous school environment. It is a school where teacher collaboration, planning, and high expectations are part of the school traditions where; families are partners; success begins with good first teaching; and there is strength in diversity. At Western Avenue School we achieve our goals of creating a culture of efficiency, collaboration, and flexibility, where all staff feels a deep responsibility for each student's learning, safety and well-being. Western's ubiquitous school motto—"Hard work can lead to great things"—is posted and repeated frequently.

A Day in the Life

David and LaShana arrive at school ready for learning. Both students come dressed in uniforms. La Shana and her siblings are greeted curbside in the "Stop Drop and Go" valet program offered by parent volunteers. David's mom walks him to the front gate where another parent volunteer invites her to the office to sign in and receive a visitor's pass for a scheduled parent conference. Both students proceed to the cafeteria where they are warmly greeted by parent volunteers and Supervision Aids and served a nutritious well-balanced breakfast. After breakfast and before the morning bell, both students have the following choices: proceed directly to the yard where energetic music gather students for morning aerobic exercises to stimulate blood flow to the brain; gather under the Pavilion where quiet games— Chess, checkers and other board games are supervised; Computer lab for STMath; or directly to the yard to await the bell. Teachers anticipate the first 8:10 bell and promptly pick up their classes and proceed to the classroom where instruction begins at 8:15. The teacher promptly takes and inputs daily attendance in ISIS. The daily agenda, standards, today's attendance, and teacher's name with room number are posted on the whiteboard for all to see. The first hour of the day is ELD or MELD instruction. LaShana knows the routine for Treasures instruction and meets with her small group while her teacher meets with another group. David likewise gathers his materials and immediately goes to the Language!4 alternative reading group with the teacher next door. Following the 2 hours of RLA they both experience 1 hour of math, 20 minutes of PE and 40 minutes of Science/Social Science. Since it is Tuesday, at the end of the day they are both invited to the Tuesday Tutoring Program where highly qualified teachers supervise after school tutoring for one hour. After tutoring, both students have the following choices: go directly home, the computer lab, or join after-school playground's YDP program. Today, David participates in intramural sports. LaShana's mom picked her up promptly after tutoring and she is done for the day. They are both excited to go home and share with their family the learning they received at school today.
