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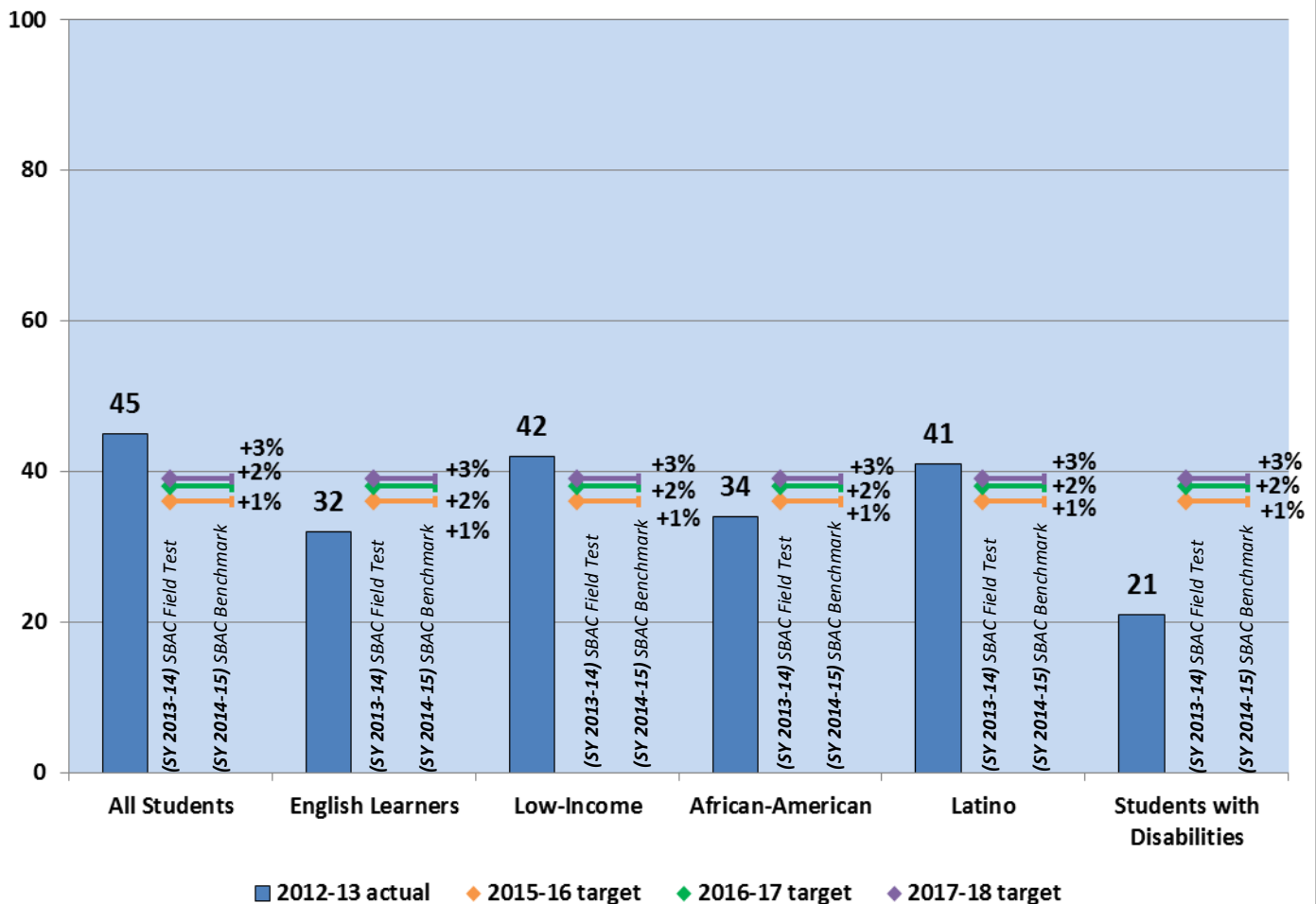

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Percentage of students Proficient or above in Math



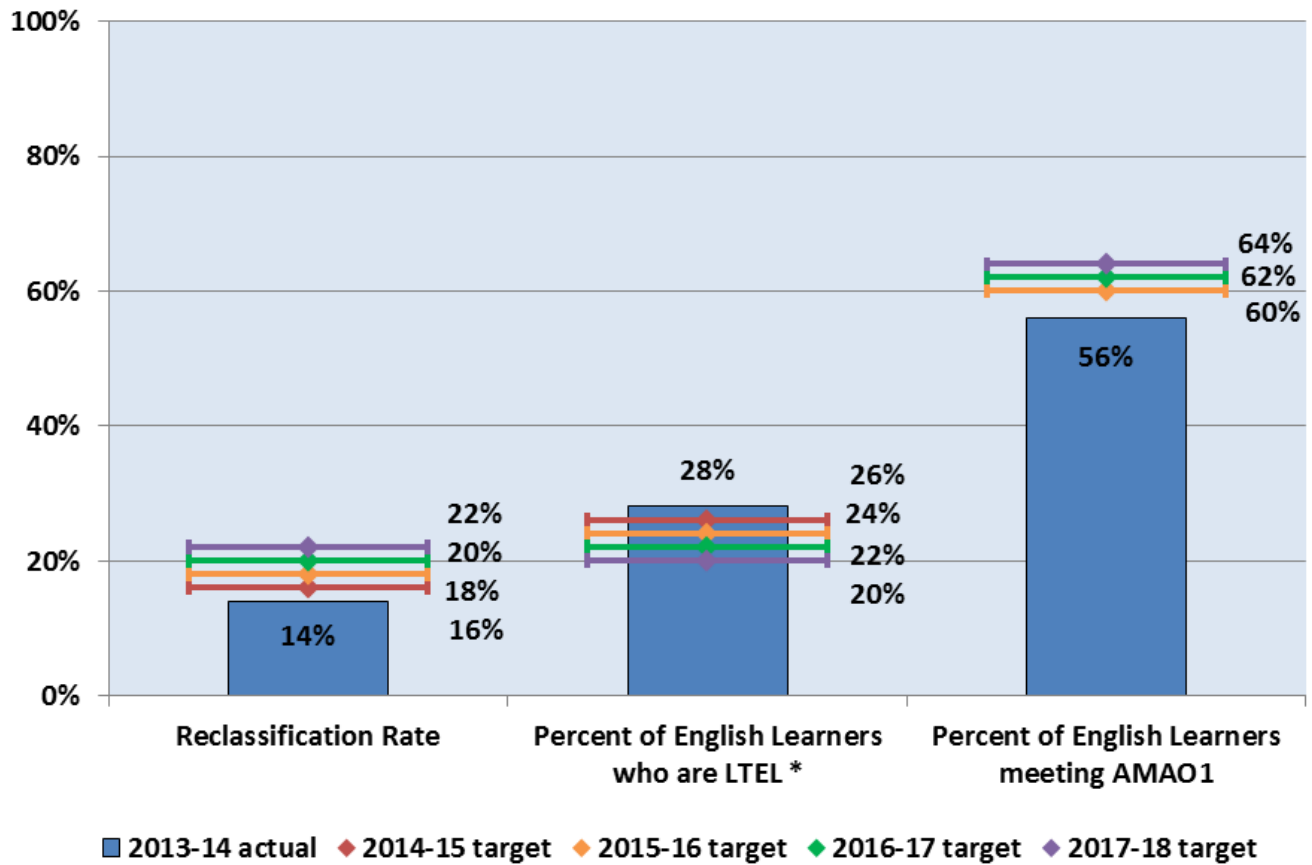

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English Learner Progress

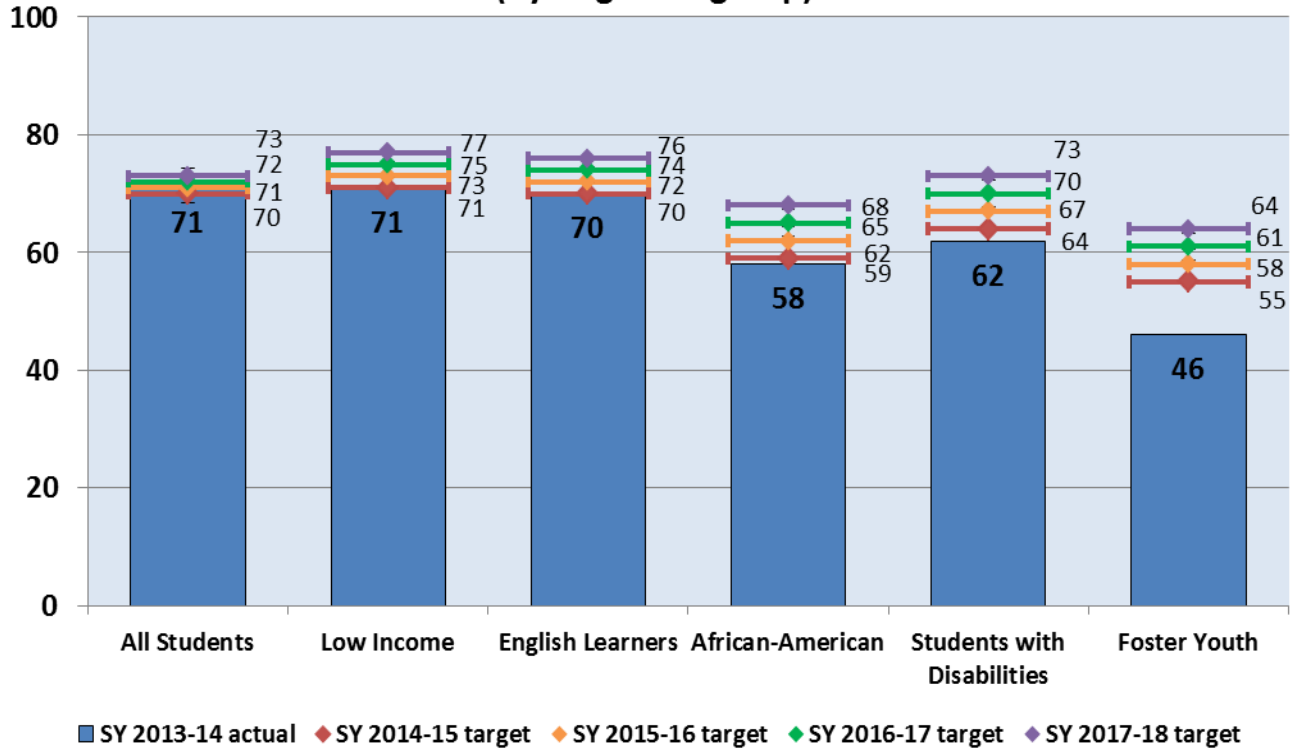

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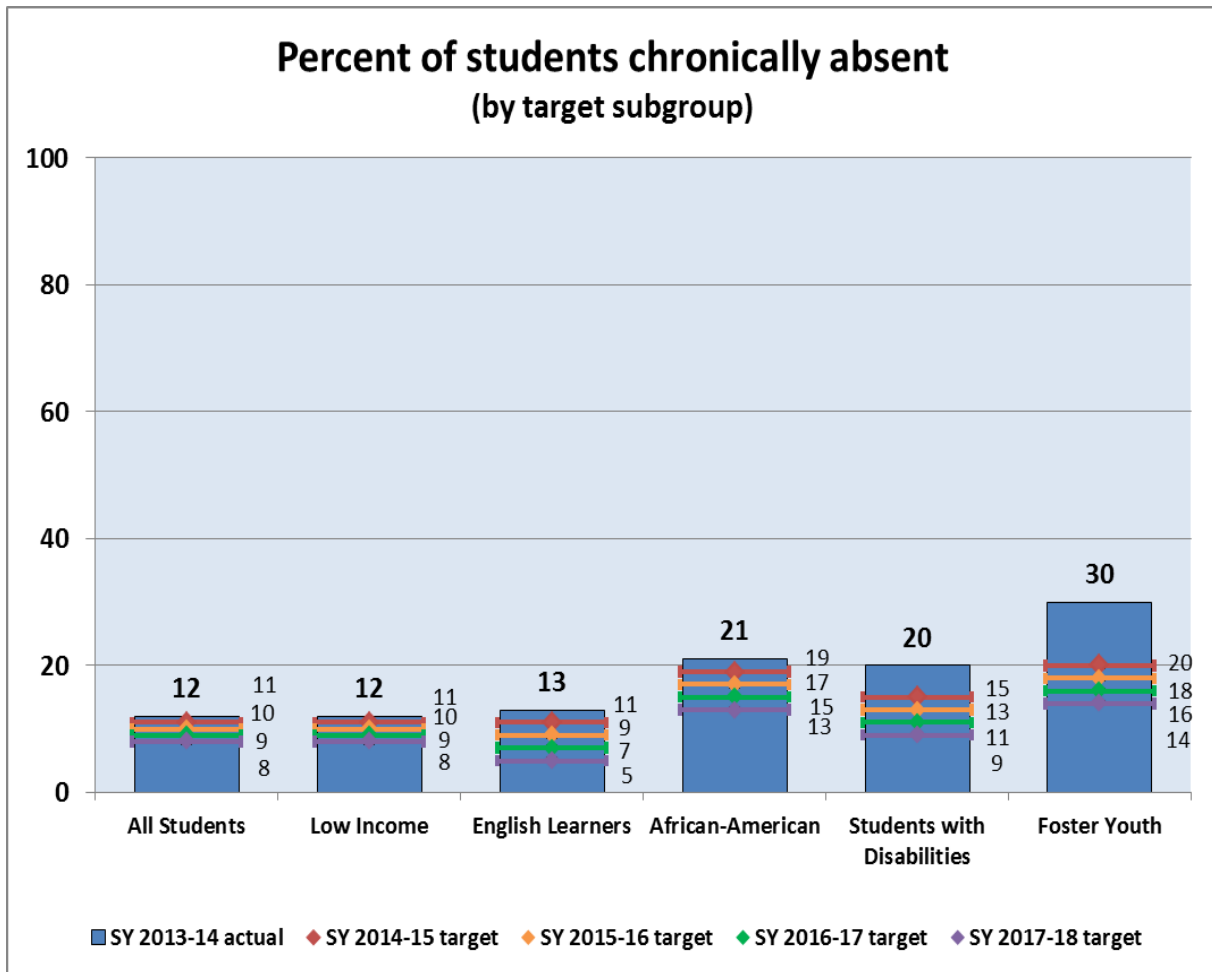
