# **SPONSORED LEGISLATION**

The Los Angeles Unified School District's legislative and funding priorities call for policy changes that make schools a safe, welcoming, and equitable place for learning. In addition to our sponsored bills identified below, the Office of Government Relations will advocate for legislative proposals and initiatives that are consistent with the District's 2022-26 Strategic Plan and the 2024 Guiding Principles and Priorities.



#### SB 98 (Portantino): Enrollment-Based Funding Study

Requires the Legislative Analyst's Office to produce a report examining ways to implement a more equitable funding model for schools based on student enrollment rather than on student attendance.



### SB 1056 (Rubio) and AB 2226 (Muratsuchi): Mandatory Kindergarten

Starting in the 2026-27 school year, requires Kindergarten before students enter 1st grade.



#### AB 2046 (Bryan): Single Gender Schools

Extends until 2035 the pilot program permitting the Los Angeles Unified School District and its authorized charter schools to offer single-gender schools or classes.



#### SB 991 (Gonzalez): Los Angeles Unified School District Office of the Inspector General

Continues the Los Angeles Unified School District's legacy of accountability by permanently authorizing the Office of the Inspector General (OIG).



#### AB 2073 (Quirk-Silva): Block Scheduling Physical Education Classes

Allows schools operating on a block schedule to offer Physical Education classes that meet the annual instructional minutes requirement without requiring a waiver from the State Board of Education.



#### AB 2998 (McKinnor): Authorization for Students to Carry Opioid Antagonist in Public Spaces

Allows minors ages 12 or older to carry and administer both prescribed and over the counter naloxone hydrochloride as an emergency measure in public spaces, including schools.



#### AB 2009 (Rendon): Public Contracts for School Facility Projects

Updates current law by adjusting for inflation two thresholds related to small school construction and maintenance projects that have not been changed in over 28 years.
