Next Tuesday, school bells will ring and students across the District will enter our classrooms excited to begin the new school year. At Local District Central, we appreciate your hard work in preparing your school to welcome staff, families, and students on their first day of instruction.

At the Superintendent's Address this week, Ms. King shared that LAUSD "is on the move". She shared that preliminary SBAC scores indicate an increase in proficiency rates across the board. The greatest news, however, was the District's projected increase in graduation to 75%, the highest graduation rate "ever" in the LAUSD.

On Friday, August 12, 2016, Local District Central added 48 graduates to the Class of 2016 during the Summer Graduation Ceremony at Virgil Middle School. Parents, grandparents, friends, school administrators, and teachers beamed with pride as their graduate walked in to the auditorium to the tune of "Pomp and Circumstance". Franklin High School has kindly offered to host the two LD Central ASB Presidents' Meetings for the 2016-17 school year.


We strongly encourage the attendance of our schools' student leaders and their sponsors. The two-hour

# 2.1 Staffing Procedures After Initial Selection Through The Fifth Week of School or

**Track:** The following procedures apply to staffing decisions which occur after the completion of the

initial spring selection process and before norm date or the end of the 5th week of school or track (whichever is sooner):

- a. The principal and department or grade level chair working together shall reasonably determine who will fill the opening or vacancy.
- In doing so, they shall utilize the teacher preference forms or locally determined method for

- identifying teacher preference and shall take into account seniority and educational program needs.
- c. If agreement is not reached or if the parties prefer, the openings and vacancies shall be filled by a new hire, transferee, substitute, or auxiliary assignment.



# More than a More than

This year, the "More Than a Meal" Campaign began in July and will continue until October 24, 2016. At that time, each school's collection data will become the basis for 2016-2017 Title I/LCFF funding eligibility.

Every school has been classified as a Provision 2/ CEP School or a Pricing School and should have already received appropriate forms.

\* Provision 2/CEP Schools will collect Household Income Forms for every student new to the District. Schools are encouraged to include the form in enrollment packets. You will need to complete the school name, location code and student ID # prior to sending the forms to the Office of Data and Accountability. \* Pricing Schools will collect 2016-2017
Meal Applications from every household.

## School-wide Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (SWPBIS)

School-wide positive behavior intervention and support (SWPBIS) fosters a culture of discipline grounded in positive behavior intervention. Positive behavior support is a systems approach for establishing the social culture and individualized behavioral supports needed for schools to achieve both social and academic success for all. It is based on research that indicates the most effective discipline systems use proactive strategies

designed to prevent discipline problems.

All staff, students, and parents should model appropriate behavior to assist in creating a positive school climate. The most effective discipline systems use proactive strategies designed to prevent discipline problems. Before consequences are given, students must first be supported in learning the skills necessary to enhance a positive school climate and avoid a negative behavior.

As the school year begins, school safety committees are encouraged to

refer to BUL-6231.0: Discipline Foundation Policy: School-Wide Positive Behavior Intervention and Support [Attachment I]for more information. 
