


## Attendance Bands: Attendance Achievement



The Attendance Bands:

- Are broken down into 5 bands: Advanced, Proficient, Basic, Below Basic, and Far Below Basic
- Track the number/percent of students in each defined attendance band
- The Performance Meter captures the percent/number of students with 96% attendance or better (Advanced and Proficient bands).




### **Proficient Attendance**




Students who have proficient attendance:

- · Have an attendance rate between 96-100%
- · Miss 7 or fewer days in an entire school year
- · Are more likely to do well academically







## Chronic Absenteeism (Absence)



Chronic Absences EC Section 60901(c)(1)

- State law defines chronic absentee as a student who is absent 10% or more days (18) in the school year for any reason excused or unexcused.
  - LAUSD defines chronic absence as missing 9% or more of the school year
- Chronic absence contributes to a variety of academic and social challenges and if often an early indicator of school failure and dropout.

- 1 in 10 kindergarten and first grade students are chronically absent, in LAUSD this number is 2 in 10
- Students that are chronically absent miss 1 month of school or more
- Many times, these students stay home with the knowledge of an adult


## A student who is chronically absent in Kindergarten:


- Is more likely to perform poorly in first grade, especially in Reading/Math
- Is more likely to have lower academic achievement in fifth grade
- · Is missing out on core instruction
- By sixth grade, a pattern of absence is a predictor of high school dropout

# High School Freshman Indicators (Chicago Public Schools Study, 2007)



- Students who fall behind in their first year of high school are less likely to graduate on time
- Attendance is the most essential requirement for avoiding course failure





## Moving Forward: 2014-15



In addition to tracking proficient attendance, the District will be setting goals for reducing chronic absenteeism.

We would like to lead the District in having the lowest chronic absenteeism, as we have led the District in the highest proficient attendance rates.
