Take a School Bus to Eaton Canyon Nature Center



Partners in Nature: School Bus Grant Program



Each year thousands of school children and their teachers from around the Los Angeles County visit Eaton Canyon Nature Center in northeast Pasadena for an introduction to the wild outdoors. Eaton Canyon Natural Area is a 190-acre zoological, botanical, and geological nature preserve situated at the base of the San Gabriel Mountains. Some children have never been in a natural setting before. The experience can change a life.

How do they arrange to come? They come on scheduled school tours, led by our experienced docent-naturalists. We lead tours for grades three to six, on Wednesdays and Fridays. (Call 626-398-5420 to schedule a tour.)



But schools have seen reduced funding in recent years, which means schools, especially "Title I" schools, may not have the funds to rent buses for the trip. Thus the Eaton Canyon Nature Center Associates have created a grant program to help schools defray the cost of bus hire. A principal, school administrator, or classroom teacher is eligible to submit the simple one page application.

Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard

Starting 2016-2017 school year, Budget Services, through MiSiS, will have the Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard to help ensure that norm day enrollment counts are accurate and transparent. This Dashboard will provide enrollment counts for norming of general education resources.

The Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard will display the enrollment counts from the Classification Report and the adjustments for excessive absences, duplicates, age ineligible, and enrollments in one course only. The adjusted norm enrollment shown on the Dashboard is preliminary until the final validations are

completed. Please refer to the attached document for instructions to navigate the new Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard (Attachment 4).

Chemical Safety Coordinator Training

Administrators at secondary schools where the school curriculum includes chemistry or science laboratory classes are required to appoint a Chemical Safety Coordinator (CSC). The CSC must be a certificated employee, preferably a science/chemistry teacher. Chemical Safety Coordinators (CSCs) are required to attend two meetings each fiscal year and complete all required duties outlined in REF-1563.3 in order to qualify for the stipend payment. 

School bus grant program: 2016-2017 school year Information Sheet

WHAT IS THE SCHOOL BUS GRANT PROGRAM?

Each year thousands of school children and their teachers come to Eaton Canyon Nature Center by school bus on docent-naturalist led field trips for an introduction to the wild outdoors. To encourage schools to send their students on our docent led tours, the Eaton Canyon Nature Center Associates have created a grant program to help schools defray transportation costs. A limited number of grants are available each year for up to \$400 per bus or a grant of \$800 for one school (ie two buses.)

WHO CAN APPLY FOR A GRANT?

Principals, school administrators, and classroom teachers for grades 3-6 in Los Angeles County are all eligible to apply. **Please note this is only for grades 3-6.**

WHAT IS THE PROCESS?

- After Sept 1, call for a reservation for a date or dates for a docent-guided tour. Tours are scheduled for school groups in **grades three to six**, 10am to 12pm, on Wednesdays and Fridays, from October until the end of the school year. Reservations are made by telephone, 626-398-5420. We can accommodate up to 60 students per tour.
- Applicants then immediately submit the application, with any additional information, and evidence of the school's financial need, including Title 1 status, if any.
- The applicants schedule their bus or buses.
- The grants can be approved on a first come/first served basis, but funds are limited. If all the criteria on the application are met; (e.g. financial need, 1 adult/10 students ratio, prior preparation of the students for the visit, whether a grant has been issued to the school in the past two years), the grant can be authorized.
- Come for the tour. Please allocate enough time to arrive by 10am.

Funds are disbursed after the tour upon receipt of documentation of the actual amount spent. They will be disbursed after the visit ONLY if the following conditions are met: The school group arrived on the confirmed date and time and checked in at the Nature Center for its docent led tour.

Welcome to Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard—SY 2016-17

Starting 2016-17 school year, Budget Services through MiSiS Enterprise Reporting system will launch the Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard to help ensure that norm day enrollment counts are accurate and transparent. This Dashboard provides enrollment counts that will be used for general education resources. Options schools (continuation high school, opportunity school, community day school, independent study, and home/hospital) are included in this Dashboard for information only, as these types of schools norm on month 6.

The purpose of this communication is as follows:

- (1) to announce the availability of the new Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard as a tool to use in monitoring the school's daily enrollment. The Dashboard will display the enrollment count on a daily basis.
- (2) to provide instruction to all users on how to navigate the new Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard.

The Dashboard will provide enrollment counts from the start of the school year (August 16, 2016) through norm day (September 16, 2016).

Dashboard's Who, Where, How, What, When, and Why?

Who has access to Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard?

The dashboard may be accessed by school principals and other school staff, local districts, fiscal specialists, and other select central office staff.

Where to find and how can the Dashboard be accessed?

Visit Budget Services and Financial Division website at http://achieve.lausd.net/Page/431 and School Fiscal Services at http://achieve.lausd.net/Page/794 for the link to the Norm Day Enrollment Dashboard.

What information is available on the Dashboard?

- Enrollment counts captured from the Classification Report and related breakdown by Program: General Ed Program, Special Ed Program, Expanded TK Program.
- Details of adjustments to enrollment count—Age Ineligible, Absences (13 days or more), Enrolled in one course, and Duplicate students
- Adjusted Norm Enrollment Count
- E-Cast %
- Warnings for Absences (greater than 9 but less than 13 days) and Unprocessed No Show students.

When will the Dashboard be available?

Using the new Dashboard tool will help the schools review their enrollment counts on a daily basis. Data issues should be resolved in a timely manner in MiSiS in order for the Dashboard to reflect or display the updated counts the following day.







Page Summary

This report monitors Norm enrollment counts from the start of the school year (August 16, 2016) through Norm Day (September 16, 2016). The enrollment count comes from the school's Classification Report which is captured in the evening of the instructional day.
