Security Precautions for School Computers - As you may be aware, recent email attacks have compromised many Single Sign On (SSO) accounts. While ITD does not provide central management over school site computer assets, Principals are asked to take precautions to safeguard their computing assets. Please insure that the latest version of antivirus software is installed on all computers. Please also remind your staff to take precautions. <u>Do not click on links in email messages</u>. Typing a website's address into your browser address line is the safest approach. Only with your continued awareness and ongoing vigilance will we be able to keep our District's computers and data properly secured.

• **Open Data** – The Open Data Dashboard (https://opendata.lausd.net) has been updated to include 2017-2018 SBAC results and 2018-2019 student enrollment based on the 2018-2019 Norm Day official counts.

- **Parent Access to LAUSD Network** Parents can now access the Internet through at schools and central offices through the LAUSD Guest network with their LAUSD Parent accounts
- **Parent Portal** Parent and Community Services has taken the lead in equipping Parents with information on the new Parent Portal and the need to reset Parent PIN codes to gain access to the Parent Portal (in follow-up to Parent letters sent on 9/28/18).
