Teachers are allowed to register the materials and resources they need on the website. Donors Choose matches those needs to donors interested in supporting their needs. Donors Choose verifies the requested items and purchases them, those items are then shipped directly to the school. There is no submission deadline and classroom registration is ongoing.

# **New Progress Report Card**

The new elementary progress report is being implemented in all elementary schools this year. Please note that there have been the following updates to the E-learning course for teachers and administrators:

- 1) The English Language Arts composite score gives an overall score for all students and is also used for reclassification purposes. Mathematics scores, including the composite score for mathematics content, are not criteria used for reclassification
- 2) Students will receive a score of 1-4 in Math Practices
- 3) TK has its own report card and Expanded TK will use the parent report from the Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP).

Additional updates include: The progress report is formatted to be printed on legal size paper. There are new progress report Grading Supports and Resources available for teachers on the New Elementary CCS Progress Report website. In addition, the Multilingual and Multicultural Education Department (MMED) has developed Comprehensive ELD grading guidance tools and resources for teachers when determining ELD progress and for dual language/bilingual schools when determining target language levels for students.

# LAUSD Arts Education Branch Professional Development in Arts Integration

LAUSD's Arts Education Branch offers FREE four-day workshops in Arts Integration throughout the year. LAUSD teachers can receive one salary point for attending all four days, and two points if homework is completed. Teachers may also receive training rate pay instead of salary points. In Arts Integration Part I, teachers will learn foundational skills in dance, music, theatre and visual arts, as well as strategies for integrating these art forms into other curricular areas. Arts Integration Part II was offered last spring with much success, and will be offered again in spring 2018. Teachers will explore arts integration in greater depth, and build on previous experiences. Arts Integration Part I class is a prerequisite. All classes are taught by LAUSD's Arts Education Branch Administrators and Credentialed Teachers.

The first teacher(s) assigned are the RST, then the instructional coach if you have one, and then finally the coordinator if you have one. Right now just three, so if you have 3 RST at your site, they will all get access before a

coach. Benchmark and Clever are working to get more co-teacher slots so that all RST, coaches and coordinators get access.
