Elementary Progress Report Card

The grading window for reporting period 2 will be open from February 9 to March 2, 2018. Remember to visit the New Report Card website at https://achieve.lausd.net/Page/13782 for helpful tools. These resources have been updated since reporting period one.

For grade entry during reporting period 2, you will notice a new feature to mass assign N/A (Not Applicable) on kindergarten through sixth grade report cards in three areas: Math Content and Concepts, Math Practices, and the Arts. N/A is not an option on the TK report card as it is both a measure of what has been taught and the skills students come to school with. TK students receive a developmental mark, not a grade. N/A is also not an option for other areas such as Science, Health, History/Social Science, Physical Education and English Language Arts as students are to receive grades in these report card strands every grading period. This mass assign feature will provide several prompts and checks before final submission of the N/A. If you go through the final submission of N/A and realize you made a mistake by picking that area, you would need to remove the mark individually by student. Introducing the Instructional Technology Initiative (ITI) Exemplars Model

The ITI Exemplars Model is an iterative, dynamic curation of instructional examples from the across the District featuring school leaders engaging in personalized learning. Through this model, educators can explore instructional practices that demonstrate key frameworks such as the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Standards, the Substitution/Augmentation/Modification/Redefinition (SAMR) Model, and the ITI Task Force Recommendations. Join the Instructional Technology Initiative for a variety of highly interactive professional learning sessions, leveraging digital tools and resources with instruction.

21st Century Learning Foundations

This is a 4-hour prerequisite that sets the foundation for the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Standards for Students Suite of Professional Learning that will be offered throughout the school year. This highly interactive session provides a deep dive into the Instructional Technology Initiative Task Force Recommendations and the ISTE Standards for Students. Learners will also engage in learning opportunities surrounding the TPACK and SAMR models. The resources shared in this session help to create a framework for examining the use of digital tools and resources to promote communication, collaboration, creativity and critical thinking to ultimately redefine teaching to support common core instruction and 21st century learning.

ISTE Standards for Students: Digital Citizen

In this 2-hour session, learners will gain understanding that being a good digital citizen is more than knowing your way around the web. It's about connecting and collaborating in ways learners didn't even know were possible. Learn what digital citizenship is and why it is so important to teach. Engage in dialogue, discussion and activities that prompt learners to think critically about online behaviors, and help prepare students to make safe, smart, and ethical decisions. Learners will leave this session with a bank of suggested resources and curriculum scope and sequence from Common Sense Education and ISTE.
