Grant and Competition Opportunities

American History and Civics Academies through the Center for Civic Education—Application due May 1, 2021

The Center's <u>American History and Civic Academies</u> provide teachers and students with high-quality educational engagement. The experience significantly enhances students' civic dispositions related to political interest and attention, political discussion, community engagement, government service, civic duty, and trust in government. <u>Research</u> from the Civic Education Research Lab at Georgetown University demonstrates that students' knowledge of history and civics improve, especially among Title I school students. In 2021, we are taking this immersive experience into a virtual setting.
