Scholarships and Grants

Warren Christopher Scholarship Awards Program, 2017 – This scholarship is open to 10th grade students in LAUSD, who demonstrates academic excellence, a commitment to community service, financial need, and ability to overcome hardship. - Only LAUSD and affiliated charter schools are eligible
- The deadlines are:
 - o Monday, February 13th Counselor identifies and submits student name that will be nominated.
 - O Monday, March 13th Scholarship application is due online.
