Physical Education

Certification for Elementary Instructional Minutes

Elementary school principals will continue monitoring physical education instructional minutes during the 2015-16 school year to ensure that students receive 200 minutes each 10 school days, per California Education Code. Certification of elementary physical education instructional minutes will be completed using the same paper certification as last school year. Site administrators will forward a copy of all signed reporting forms (Attachments A for teacher certification and B for principal certification of Mem-6482) to the LD Superintendent or designee by January 15, 2016. A tutorial with instructions for teachers and principals regarding the completion of both certification documents are available in the form of a PowerPoint on the Physical Education website. Writeable electronic versions of the forms are also available and may be forwarded electronically via e-mail to the appropriate LD office. By January 25, 2016, the LD Superintendent shall complete and sign the Local District Superintendent Certification of Physical Education Minutes (Attachment D of Mem-6482) and forward to Dr. Janice Collins, Physical Education Administrator, via e-mail at janice.collins@lausd.net. A copy of all forms shall be kept at the LD until June 2018.

Furthermore, all elementary schools are required to post the school's physical education bell schedule in the main office or on the school's website. *It should indicate the designated time when each teacher (Kdgn. exempt) provides physical education instruction.*

Central office is currently developing a pilot program for an online certification process in an effort to replace the paper certification process during the spring semester of 2016. Information will be forth coming to school administrators who have volunteered to participate in the pilot certification process. A-G INTERVENTION AND SUPPORT – PASS Professional Development

Master Schedule Timeline

MEM – 6599.0 – "Allocation of Z-Time Funds for Secondary Counselors to Support Completion of Individual Graduation Plans for Foster Youth" explains the allocation of funding intended to help ensure that all foster youth attending secondary schools have an IGP. Funding will be allocated for secondary counselors to work with foster youth beyond the regular school day. Allocated funds may only be used to pay Secondary Counselors (0533) Z-Time to provide direct services to foster youth.

Did you know the 2016-17 FAFSA is available January 1st?

As the cost of college continues to increase, securing financial aid must become an important part of the college application process. The Education Trust-West reports only about HALF of financially aid untapped. Financial aid is critical for our students when you consider that a strong correlation exists between *FAFSA* completion and college enrollment.

Electronic portfolios are an effective form of assessing learning outcomes and student achievement as well as diagnosing curriculum deficiencies that require improvement. They encourage students to engage in self-reflection and focus on mastering higher order thinking, effective communications, and collaborative abilities. Currently 19 high schools are working in collaboration with ConnectEd, Envision Schools and the LAUSD Linked Learning office to calibrate learning mastery across the following skills: Analysis, Argumentation, Inquiry, and Problem Solving. LAUSD Linked Learning student portfolios have a minimum of one artifact for each of those skills in addition to a Resume, Personal Statement Essay, Community Engagement project and a Career Pathway artifact. There were over 50 teachers and

ESEA REAUTHORIZATON - Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

Reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act and the CORE School Quality Improvement System (CORE Waiver)

The reauthorization of ESEA, which now is titled, *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA) has passed in both the House and Senate, with final signature from President Obama on December 10, 2015. Several highlights from the bill are that it:

- Eliminates adequate yearly progress (AYP) and highly qualified teacher requirements
- Provides strong support for teachers and school leaders
- Broadens accountability systems to include multiple measures of student performance, educator effectiveness, and school quality
- Requires states to provide assurances that they have adopted challenging standards in reading, mathematics, and science and allows for the adoption of standards in other content areas

LAUSD, along with 5 other California districts, has been operating under a waiver from specific requirements of the now obsolete No Child Left Behind (NCLB) law. With the reauthorization of ESEA, the NCLB waivers will no longer necessary. The current waiver and requirements associate with it will continue to be in effect through the end of this school year (2015-2016).

A new state system will go into effect for the 2017-2018 school year. With a year's lag time, it is currently unclear what accountability system will be in place for the 2016-2017 school year. As information is received, we will continue to bring updates to our LAUSD stakeholders.
