Change in My Math Digital Content Access

Starting on August 1, the My Math digital content access for 2016-2017 will be through the LAUSD Single Sign On. Teachers and students will navigate to the <u>LAUSD Single Sign On</u> and enter their SSO for access. Teacher and student accounts will automatically be populated with the grade level textbook. Teacher accounts will automatically be populated with the class roster. Administrators and out-of-the-classroom personnel who support math instruction will be given access instructions in August 2016. Any teacher-created materials saved on McGraw-Hill Education SSO access need to be saved by the teacher to his or her own computer prior to July 22, as the accounts will be wiped by McGraw-Hill Education. For teachers who used other **ConnectEd** access in the 2015-2016 school year, these paths will not be supported, and will close July 22, 2016. Any teacher-created materials saved on **ConnectEd** need to be saved by the teacher to her or his own computer prior to July 22, 2016 as the accounts will be wiped by McGraw Hill Education.

ALEKS online remediation, a component of My Math, will not be continuing for the 2016-2017 school year. This was a one-year purchase. Some school sites are funding their own continued access.

The Division of Instruction is in the process of updating the memoranda to reflect this change. The assessments will be available to schools for internal use as one means of informing instruction, but will no longer be used for placement decisions.

UCOP Course Lists for 2016-20

The 2016-2017 "A-G" course submission to the University of California Office of the President (UCOP) is underway. Initial course list submissions have been made to the UC Course Management Portal for schools in all local districts.

Additional revisions to the "A-G" course list, reflective of changes to school course offerings, are due to local district counseling coordinators by August 31, 2016. Revisions should be made on attachment "C" of REF-5833.4, *Revision of the UC/CSU A-G Approved Course List*.

AB-288 Public Schools: College and Career Access Pathways Partnerships

The Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) and the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) have been formally working together since February 2016 to develop a regional framework under the AB 288 initiative. Under the theme of collaboration, the two systems have been working to develop the necessary pathways that will serve students seeking to develop the skills needed for future jobs and careers.

Concurrent enrollment promises expanded offerings for high school students allowing them to take more college courses and be introduced to college-level coursework both on a high school campus and at the community colleges.

The two entities have discussed issues that will be included in the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) including fiscal implications (ADA, facilities, materials, fees), logistics with schools, staffing, and implications for EL and Special Education students.

LINKED LEARNING – Upcoming Opportunities

Linked Learning conducted two teacher team meetings in June 2016 that centered on sharing best practices, the importance of teacher calibration for grading, and the importance of reflection and revision within the portfolio and defense process. Another round of Portfolio and Defense work will be scheduled for next year. Linked Learning pathways will be invited to participate and all teachers and administrators will be invited to observe and learn.
