**PURPOSE**: The purpose of this reference guide is to provide elementary schools with the

> necessary form and instructions for obtaining parental agreement for a student to continue in kindergarten for an additional year. This form is required for a student who will be retained in Kindergarten, as well as for a Kindergarten-aged student who is placed in Transitional Kindergarten at the parent/guardian's

**BACKGROUND:** The California Department of Education defines Kindergarten Continuance as

> having more than one school year in kindergarten. California Education Code sections 48011 and 48070-48070.5 provide that after a child has been lawfully admitted to kindergarten and has attended for a year, the child shall be promoted to the first grade unless the school district and the child's parent/guardian agree to have the child continue to attend kindergarten for not longer than one additional year. This rule applies whether a child begins kindergarten at the

beginning of a school year or at some later date. Kindergarten students who

have previously attended TK or ETK, are not eligible for retention.

A parent/guardian who agrees to have their child continue in kindergarten must sign the Kindergarten Continuance Form. This form is required for students who will be retained in kindergarten. It is also required for kindergarten-aged students who are placed in Transitional Kindergarten (TK grade level). Kindergartenaged students are those whose fifth birthday is on or before September 1 of the

current school year.

### REF-6756.1 Division of Instruction

A *Kindergarten Continuance Form* is *not* needed for children who are ageeligible for TK and are enrolled accordingly. A child is eligible for TK if their fifth birthday is between September 2 and December 2 (inclusive) of the current school year.

Failure to have signed/dated forms on file may result in audit findings and loss of apportionment.

### INSTRUCTIONS: I. Kindergarten Continuance Form

- A. Timing of Completion of the Kindergarten Continuance Form
  - 1. For Kindergarten-aged students enrolled in TK in the current year: Complete the form at the time of enrollment into TK.
  - 2. For Kindergarten students to be retained in the following school year: Complete the form by the end of the current school year or before the Kindergarten anniversary date.
- B. Complete items 1 to 5 of the *California Department of Education Kindergarten Continuance Form, Parental Agreement for Pupil to Continue in Kindergarten* (Attachment A-1 or A-2).

Note: Kindergarten students who have previously attended TK or TE are not eligible for retention.

See below for information on the items to be completed. A sample of the form is provided in section E, with dates applicable to the example below.

- 1. Name of School Enter the complete name of the school.
- 2. Name of Pupil Enter the full name of the student who will continue in kindergarten for an additional year.
- 3. Kindergarten Attendance Anniversary Date
  - a. For a student who will be retained in kindergarten, enter the date which is one year from the student's enrollment date (E date) in Kindergarten.

For example: A student enrolled in kindergarten on October 1, 2020. This student's anniversary date would then be October 1, 2021.



- b. For a kindergarten-aged student placed in Transitional Kindergarten (TK), enter the date which is one year from the enrollment date in TK.
- 4. Name of School Official Approving for District Enter the name of your school's administrator, e.g., school principal's name.
- 5. "...continue in kindergarten until" Enter June 30 of the anniversary school year. In the above example, the student's anniversary school year is 2021-22. Therefore, for item 5, enter June 30, 2022.
- C. Have parent/guardian fully complete item 6, which is the section at the bottom of the form. It is critical that the form be signed and dated by the parent/guardian before the student begins his/her second year of kindergarten.
- D. Provide a copy of the signed and dated form to the parent/guardian and place the original in the student's cumulative record.
- E. Below is a sample of the Kindergarten Continuance Form displaying the anniversary date and the "...continue in kindergarten until" date of a student who enrolled in kindergarten on October 1, 2020.

	California law provides that after a child has been lawfully admitted to Kindergarten and has attended for a year, the child shall be promoted to the first grade unless the school district and the child's parent/guardian agree to have the child continue to attend Kindergarten for not longer than one additional year. This rule applies whether a child begins kindergarten at the beginning of a school year or at some later date. Because kindergarten-age children often do not develop at steady or predictable rates, the California Department of Education recommends that approval for a child to continue not be given until near the anniversary of a child's admittance to kindergarten.

#### II. MISIS GRADE LEVEL PLACEMENT AND RETENTION

To support schools in programing ETK, TK and Kindergarten students appropriately, the following table provides guidance for MiSiS enrollment, grade assignments, and kindergarten continuance/retention.

A. TE (ETK), TK, and K Enrollment/Retention Guidance Scenarios in the table below assume that student was not enrolled in TE or TK in the prior school year (2019-20).

B. Depending on a student's grade level in the prior school year(s), placement in certain grade levels are not allowed in the current school year. Grade levels in the 2020-21 column below are disallowed, as explained in the Reason column.

- C. Enrollment Reminders Related to Kindergarten Continuance
  - 1. A Kindergarten-aged student can only be enrolled in TK if a completed, signed Kindergarten Continuance form is available.
  - 2. A first-grade age eligible student may only be enrolled in Kindergarten if they have no prior TE or TK enrollment.



- D. End of Year Automatic Rollover for the Following Academic Year
  - 1. TE students will automatically roll over to Kindergarten
  - 2. TK students will automatically roll over to Kindergarten
  - 3. Kindergarten students will automatically roll over to First grade

Schools may make changes to grade assignments for individual students who have been automatically rolled over. These changes must adhere to kindergarten continuance/retention guidelines.

#### III. FOCUS DASHBOARD MONITORING REPORT

- A. School administrators are encouraged to access the Elementary Schools Retention Warning on the Focus dashboard.
- B. Prior to the start of the school year, the report should be used to:
  - 1. Identify any kindergarten students who were appropriately retained, but who are missing the completed, signed Kindergarten Continuance Form. These forms should be completed prior to the first day of attendance.
  - 2. Modify grade or class placement for students who are not eligible to be retained (e.g., students who attended ETK or TK prior to being retained at the end of kindergarten).
- C. Prior to norm day, administrators should share the report with kindergarten teachers and office personnel to:
  - 1. Identify any kindergarten students who were appropriately retained, but who are missing the completed, signed Kindergarten Continuance Form. These forms should be completed prior to the first day of attendance.
  - 2. Modify grade or class placement for students who are not eligible to be retained (e.g., students who attended ETK or TK prior to being retained at the end of kindergarten).


### Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Kindergarten Continuance (Retention)

- Q1: Does a student who is age eligible for Kindergarten who is placed in TK and then promoted to Kindergarten for the following year need a Kindergarten Continuance form?
- A1: Yes. The Kindergarten Continuance form should have been completed for this student when he/she was placed in TK.
- Q2: Does a student who is age eligible for Kindergarten and attends Kindergarten, but then is retained in Kindergarten for the following year need a Kindergarten Continuance Form?
- A2: Yes, this student must have a completed, signed Kindergarten Continuance Form on file in the cumulative record. The form must be signed and dated prior to the beginning of the student's second year of kindergarten. Retained kindergarten students without this form on file result in a loss of Average Daily Attendance (ADA) funds, up to \$12,000.
- Q3: Does a student who is age eligible for Kindergarten and attends some Kindergarten, but then is transferred from Kindergarten to TK during the same year need a Kindergarten Continuance Form completed again the following year?
- A3: No, the Kindergarten Continuance form should have been completed for this student when he/she was placed in TK but their age made them eligible for kindergarten.
- Q4: Do students moving from TK or ETK one year to Kindergarten the next year need a continuance form?
- A4: It depends. The Kindergarten Continuance Form is not needed for children who are age-eligible for TK and ETK who promote to kindergarten the following year. The CDE recognizes that they are in a two-year kindergarten program. Please note that at the end of their kindergarten year, these students are not eligible for retention because they have already completed their maximum two years of kindergarten. However, for Kindergarten-aged students who were placed in TK, see response for Question 1.
- Q5: If a student only attended part of a year of TK or ETK and a year of kindergarten, can they be retained again in kindergarten?
- A5: No, students who attended any TK or ETK are not eligible for retention.
