**Consider a Fall Diversity Fly-In Program –** College diversity programs that pay for high-achieving high school seniors – who are usually low-income, first-generation or students of color – to visit campus, give teens who can't afford to travel out of state for a college tour the opportunity to try the college experience.

The programs, typically called "Fly-In" or multicultural programs, are two- to three-day college tours for prospective students from underrepresented backgrounds. Some schools invite all students to apply but give preference to low-income students. Fly-in programs give participants an opportunity to imagine life as a college freshman. Teens get an extensive look at student life, build connections and see if they can manage without having their parents nearby.

**City and County of Los Angeles Summer Youth Work Program –** The City and County of Los Angeles in partnership with the Work Experience Education Office will be hiring students for summer work opportunities. Student eligibility for all of the summer work programs is as follows:

- 1) Be 14 24 years old
- 2) City or County of Los Angeles resident
- 3) Meet at least one (1) of the following criteria:
  - a. Live in a low income household
    - b. Receive CalWorks/TANF public assistance
    - c. Categorized as a foster youth
- 4) Must have the right to work in the U.S.

Students who apply on-line are not guaranteed a summer job as the selection process will be conducted via lottery.
