Pre-Register to Vote at 16 – Students who are 18 years and older are encouraged by the LAUSD Board of Education to exercise their right to vote. <u>Information</u>. California Secretary of State Alex Padilla has implemented a program through which eligible students who are 16 or 17 can pre-register to vote, and their registration will automatically take effect when they turn 18. This is an easy and convenient way for a student to ensure that his or her voice is heard. There are four steps for a student to pre-register and vote:

- 1. Visit the California online voter registration webpage: registertovote.ca.gov
- 2. Pre-register and indicate that you are 16 or 17
- 3. Become automatically registered on your 18th birthday

Students who are already 18 may register to vote on this website as well.
