Instructional Technology Initiative

Join the Instructional Technology Initiative for a variety of highly interactive professional learning sessions, leveraging digital tools and resources with instruction.

21st Century Learning Foundations

This is a 4-hour prerequisite that sets the foundation for the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Standards for Students Suite of Professional Learning that will be offered throughout the school year. This highly interactive session provides a deep dive into the Instructional Technology Initiative Task Force Recommendations and the ISTE Standards for Students. Learners will also engage in learning opportunities surrounding the TPACK and SAMR models. The resources shared in this session help to create a framework for examining the use of digital tools and resources to promote communication, collaboration, creativity and critical thinking to ultimately redefine teaching to support common core instruction and 21st century learning.

ISTE Standards for Students: Digital Citizen

In this 2-hour session, learners will gain understanding that being a good digital citizen is more than knowing your way around the web. It's about connecting and collaborating in ways learners didn't even know were possible. Learn what digital citizenship is and why it is so important to teach. Engage in dialogue, discussion and activities that prompt learners to think critically about online behaviors, and help prepare students to make safe, smart, and ethical decisions. Learners will leave this session with a bank of suggested resources and curriculum scope and sequence from Common Sense Education and ISTE.

By the end of this session, learners will have designed a lesson that gives them the opportunity to capture student thought process, and enable them to facilitate a learning experience that promotes reflection and construction of knowledge.
