Celebrate October Dyslexia Month

There are many myths and misconceptions that surround dyslexia:

Myth #1: Dyslexia is a visual problem.

Fact: Many young children reverse letters when learning to write. Students with dyslexia have difficulty attaching the appropriate labels or names to letters and words; however, there is no scientific evidence that they actually see letters and words backward.

Myth #2: Dyslexia can be outgrown.

Fact: Dyslexia is a specific learning disability which is neurobiological in origin. It is not something you outgrow; however, with early intervention and appropriate accommodations, literacy outcomes greatly improve for students with dyslexia.

The Association of American Educators (AAE) is a non-profit organization that seeks to foster greater professionalism in the classroom. AAE offers educations grants up to \$500 to be used for a variety of projects and materials, including but not limited to books, software, calculators, math manipulatives, art supplies, audio-visual equipment, and lab materials. Funds must be used within one year of the application deadline. AAE makes grants available to full time educators that have not received a

scholarship or grant from AAE in the past two years. AAE awards are competitive and application deadlines are 11:59 PM EST October 1st and March 1st.

California Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom Literacy for Life Grant http://learnaboutag.org/grants/life.cfm

The California Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom (CFAC) is a non-profit dedicated to educating youth throughout California about the importance of agriculture in their daily lives. CFAC accomplishes this by developing materials that are accurate, teacher-tested and scientifically sound to enhance the educational experience of K-12 students, providing programs, inspiration and training opportunities for educators, partnering with likeminded organizations to create awareness about the significance of agriculture in our everyday lives, and recognizing teachers and students for their achievements in agricultural literacy. The Literacy for Life grant is sponsored by the Oreggia Family Foundation, and is designed to help initiate new projects or expand existing ones that promote agricultural literacy. Grants of up to \$500 are provided to California K-12 educators to support the integration of agriculture into regular classroom instruction. The Literacy for Life grant application deadline is October 1, 2017.

Northrop Grumman Foundation Teachers Academy

The Northrop Grumman Foundation Teachers Academy, which is in its third year, sponsors middle school teachers for a professional learning experience to promote STEM education. The main goal of the Northrop Grumman Foundation Teachers Academy is to elevate STEM education in middle school grades within school districts located in Northrop Grumman communities. The Academy focuses on stimulating student interest in engineering curriculum and careers by offering effective blended professional learning for teachers.

LAUSD Arts Education Branch Professional Development in Arts Integration

LAUSD's Arts Education Branch offers four-day workshops in Arts Integration throughout the year. LAUSD teachers can receive one salary point for attending all four days, and two points if homework is completed.

Teachers may also receive training rate instead of salary points. In Arts Integration Part I, teachers will learn foundational skills in dance, music, theatre and visual arts, as well as strategies for integrating these art forms into other curricular areas. Arts Integration Part II was offered last spring with much success, and will be offered again in spring 2018. Teachers will explore arts integration in greater depth, and build on previous experiences. Arts Integration Part I class is a prerequisite. All classes are taught by LAUSD's Arts Education Branch Administrators and Credentialed Teachers.
