SN 705 B- Health Assessment III Child

NURS SN 705 is an 8-week course designed to prepare the school nurse credential candidate (SNSCC) to understand, develop, and utilize nursing knowledge to perform a head-to-toe health assessment of the chronically ill student in the school setting. The SNSCC will examine common variations, pathophysiology, how disease affects body systems and its consequences related to health and wellness, school and community health and student achievement. The unit focus will be on developing strategies and skills required for clinical decision-making using interviewing skills, completing a health history, the progression of critical thinking, and the understanding of cultural dynamics in the chronically ill student. It will provide the SNSCC opportunities activities to learn to develop and implement plans of care with emphasis on health-related needs of the chronically ill student in the educational setting. The SNSCC will use the Los Angeles web-based software system to document and track health information. This course focuses on the chronically ill and medically fragile child and its pathophysiology thereby continuing the concepts discussed in NURS SN 705 (Health Assessment).
