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



Designed for teachers of Grades 6-12, this collaborative workshop will help participants unlock the requirements of SBA ELA Performance Task and develop lessons that target critical literacy skills and standards.

Using released Smarter Balanced Assessment materials as an anchor, participants will explore and practice strategies like Thought Prompts, Three Reads Protocol, and the Do-What Chart – approaches to help students extend and organize their thinking about the text they read. Participants will have time to reflect on how they can incorporate the strategies in their classrooms, and to share their thinking with others.

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
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Deepening Academic Conversations

- brain-based instructional strategies

In this workshop, participants will 1) learn what intrinsic motivation looks like, 2) explore six high impact approaches to foster motivation in the classroom, and 3) learn instructional strategies that will bring out the inner motivation that all our students possess.



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
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Informational Text Structure & Project Based Instruction

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
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Math Practices that Develop Critical Thinkers and Confident Problem Solvers

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
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Organizing and Delivering Instruction With Schoology

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
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Picture Books to Start SEL Conversations
