Supporting Individual Learners Through Instruction

Your students come from diverse backgrounds and are at different instructional levels. When planning for instruction, teachers select **teaching approaches** to recognize and build on the rich knowledge, experiences, cultures, skills, and languages students bring to the classroom.

Some teaching approaches you may consider are:

- Getting to know your students -Sample Survey Questions
- Plan lessons for different learning levels <u>Lesson Planning Tool</u>
- Collaborative Grouping
 - -Homogeneous Grouping-Group students with similar skill levels or language proficiency
 - -Heterogeneous Grouping -Mix students with varying skill levels, backgrounds, or language abilities
 - -Interest-Based Groups -Group students based on shared interests or chosen topics
 - -Role-Based Groups-Assign each student a role (e.g., recorder, timekeeper, facilitator, reporter)

Native American Heritage Month



Native American Heritage Month, celebrated every November, honors the history, diverse cultures, and significant contributions of Indigenous peoples of North America. Officially established by Congress in 1990, the month provides a platform for Native Americans to share their traditions, celebrate accomplishments and raise awareness about the challenges their communities face.

The Office of Human Relations, Diversity & Equity has curated a collection of <u>Advisory Lessons</u> for educators to share with students.

Homeless Youth Awareness Month

In 2007, Congress passed its first resolution recognizing November as National Homeless Youth Awareness Month (NHYAM) to raise awareness about youth homelessness, its causes, potential solutions, and the importance of prevention efforts. Since then, November has served as a time to spotlight the issue, honor those working to support homeless youth, and strengthen the national commitment to ending youth

homelessness.

TLF FOCUS ELEMENT OF THE MONTH

TLF FOCUS ELEMENT 1B1:

AWARENESS OF STUDENTS' SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE, AND LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

As a teacher, understanding your students' skills, knowledge, and language proficiency is important to supporting their ability to achieve their full potential.

Indicators of Effective Practice

- Teacher demonstrates knowledge of student cultural/linguistic assets during instruction
- Teacher strategies/classroom artifacts demonstrate planning for student skills, knowledge, and language proficiency (e.g., sentence frames, student data charts, small group instruction)
- Teacher's tasks/learning activities are differentiated based on learners' language proficiency
- Teacher's tasks/learning activities are differentiated for learners' skills
- Teacher's tasks/learning activities are differentiated for learners' knowledge

Examples of Effective Strategies include:

- Incorporate texts, examples, and themes that reflect students' cultural backgrounds and experiences.
- Use **i-Ready** data to form small groups based on skill level or language proficiency.
- Activate and connect to background knowledge before introducing new content.
- Clearly post and explain what students are expected to learn in ways they can understand.
- Pair English learners with peers who can model academic language.
- Allow students to choose how they demonstrate understanding.



PROVISIONAL TEACHERS

Are you on track to meet your provisional requirements?

- Do you know whether you currently hold a Provisional Intern Permit (PIP) or a Short-Term Staff Permit (STSP)?
- Are you aware of your permit's expiration date?
- Have you met the subject matter requirement?
- Will you be intern eligible before your contract expires?

If you're unsure about any of these questions, it's important to connect with your Credentials and Contracts Specialist as soon as possible. To find out who your assigned specialist is, you can:

- Visit **cccs** and search by school name (bottom right of the page).
