Strategic Plan and District Updates

2022-23 Fall Priorities for Los Angeles Unified

- 1. Staffing Positions at School Sites: This effort has included opening the school year to ensure all classrooms are staffed with a classroom teacher at the start of the school year.
- 2. Alignment of Support to Schools from Six Local Districts to four Regional



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Offices: We continue to reiterate that our Community of School offices will continue to support their existing school sites. If you are in need of support please visit the school directory, type the name of the school, and you will see a link to the Community of School webpage. Another resource is to call the Regional Office and ask for guidance. If you call an office that does not support your school, they will direct you to the correct office: achieve.lausd.net/regions.

Pillar 3: Engagement and Collaboration

- Parent Portal and LAUSD Mobile App: The upgraded version of the Parent Portal will be made available to families this winter and will also go live in the upgraded version of the LAUSD Mobile App 3.0. The Parent Portal will evolve to include the Districts' new Individual Acceleration Plan.
- School Volunteer Program Management System: The site has included new
 efficiencies that inform prospective volunteers and school employers pending
 actions missing in order to approve the application. In the month of January
 alone the team processed 800 applications. The team leads are also to date in
 processing applications processed by the school site.
- The Family Academy Course Catalogue and Equity Course Pathways: The Family Academy continues to build great momentum. Evaluations completed by participants have offered comments and scores showing participants are learning information to act in their child's education, to be civically engaged and to connect to valuable resources. In person learning and engagement will continue through webinars and in person opportunities to engage will initiate this month.
- Budget Development Season: Due to the cyber incident all updates to the School
 Directory are available withing the LAUSD. ITD is not working to release updated
 budget sheets and resources outside of the LAUSD network. The budget cycle is
 beginning this month and schools are required to lead engagement with the
 community at large to inform the short term and long-term school objectives.
- Professional Development: Regions have started hosting professional
 development convenings for their school teams where principals, assistance
 principals, coordinators, Parent and Family Center, and office staff are invited to
 complete clinics focused on family engagement. Region host started the cycle on
 January 27 by bringing together school sites from the northeast.
