LA County Department of Public Health Update

The LAUSD is aware of the recently issued Los Angeles County Department of Public Health order indicating schools may allow for specialized in-school services for small cohorts of specific populations of students (students with IEPs or English Learners needing assessments and/or specialized in-school services) beginning September 14, 2020. The District is committed to providing optimal opportunities for student learning. However, first and foremost, safety of our staff and students is our priority. Plans for in-school services will move forward once we ensure appropriate safety measures including testing and contact tracing are in place. We will continue to work on plans to best support our students and will provide updated information as we do so.

District Validation Review (DVR): LAUSD's Special Education School Review Process

DVR teams will conduct comprehensive reviews of school site level compliance with special education laws, regulations, as well as District policies and procedures. The reviews will take place on virtual platforms and/or in selected schools from all six local districts, including independent charter schools, and are tentatively scheduled from October 2020 through March 2021.

Significant Disproportionality Plan

As required by the California Department of Education, LAUSD is required to finalize a Significant Disproportionality Plan by December 20, 2020. This 3-year plan will require LAUSD to address the following areas:

- The number of African American Students with Disabilities suspended or expelled
- The number of African American Students with Disabilities found eligible for special education services in the category of emotional disturbance

The Division of Special Education is currently organizing a process plan for collecting parent feedback to address each area of the plan and will present the plan at next month's CAC meeting.

Coronavirus Response and School Reopening Guidance

The California Department of Education (CDE) is monitoring the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation and working closely with agency partners. Local educational agencies (LEAs) are encouraged to follow California Department of Public Health recommendations.
