QUESTIONS DURING THE SPECIAL EDUCATION UPDATE REPORT			
1. Has the School Family and Support Services office (SFSS) taken over the function of the Complaint Response Unit (CRU)?	Yes, <u>SFSS</u> continues the functionalities of the former Complaint Response Unit as of January 1, 2020.		
2. Where do we submit our questions/concerns?	Concerns are encouraged to be voiced with your child's case carrier and/or school administrator. Parents are also able to contact us at (213) 241-6701.		
3. How is the call categorized when an issue hasn't been resolved? For example, when the district is unable to find a satisfactory resolution for the student & parent or is forced to legally escalate their dispute with the district?	Concerns are logged and categorized appropriately.		
4. Parents at non-public schools that are funded by LAUSD are being advised that there are no transportation services available and that they can get reimbursed. However, many parents are not able to do so. Transportation is included in their IEP for most if not all District funded NPS students and so what can be done?	Parents in these situations are encouraged to contact <u>SFSS</u> for support. We have a team that can connect with our Nonpublic School partners to help resolve the transportation concern.		
5. How will LAUSD handle the massive requests for IEP meetings since it is required to hold an IEP if a parent wants to enroll their student at City of Angels? What supports are being provided at the school site level to understand this process?	LAUSD conducts over 120,000 IEPs annually. The Division of Special Education has funded additional Special Education support during the summer and after work hours to support the completion of IEPs needed to address requests for enrollment in independent study. IEPs are individualized and vary in the length of time to conduct.

Blackboard connect announcements were sent to families, information was provided in town hall meetings and the Division of Special Education posted an announcement on the website's homepage to inform families about the City of Angels Independent Study/Virtual Academy before the beginning of the school year. The announcement, still posted, provides families with a brief description of the online program and the requirement to hold an IEP team meeting to discuss the appropriateness of the placement request. LAUSD is committed to ensuring the parents of students with disabilities are aware of their IEP rights. The Daily Pass accessibility is monitored, and its capacity has been addressed to ensure that all can generate a pass to enter school.	
QUESTIONS DURING THE CITY OF ANGELS (COA) PRESENTATION			
1.	What kind of services and accommodations is City of Angels offering to students with IEPs and 504s? Are they offering any at all? How are students in the independent study program receiving their services?	Students with disabilities are receiving their educational program, including related services and accommodations/modifications, as prescribed in their IEP.	
2.	Can City of Angels offer related services virtually? Or special education curriculum? What services are being offered – BII, APE, SAI, OT, Speech?	Related services can be offered while students participate in independent study (City of Angels). Services may be offered in person or virtually, depending on the needs of the student, as determined through the IEP process.	
3.	Is there a general education opportunity at City of Angels for students with IEPs?	Yes, students with disabilities can be included in the General Education setting at City of Angels based on the offer in their IEP.	
4.	What is being done for the 1,400 students who want online education, but their IEP status is still unresolved?	The DSE is monitoring the progress of all IEPs for students whose families have indicated an interest in Online Independent Study. Each Local District/Community of School is also monitoring the progress by reviewing their data and supporting schools to offer and hold meetings.	





5.	Why were IEP meetings not held before the beginning of the school year?	Due to schedules, this was not always possible. However, some IEP team meetings were held before the school year began. Since school started, school site teams have been working diligently to complete IEPs.		
6.	When will these questions be addressed and answered? Is it possible to get the questions and answers in written form to share with other parents/stakeholders?	We will address all questions and follow the protocol set up last year. Questions and answers will be given to PCS to be disseminated to the CAC.		
7.	What are students who are not able to attend in person supposed to do while waiting for mediation?	Following the IEP team meeting held to discuss placement in independent study, students will be expected to participate in the program set forth by their IEP team.		
8.	Who is the best person to contact if parents have questions about the services offered at City of Angels?	Parents are encouraged to reach out to their school administration as a starting point. Also, each LD has a designated Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) Specialist to support with Independent Study for students with disabilities. The Special Education Local District directory is available on the Division of Special Education <i>Contact Us</i> webpage. (DSE Directory)		
9.	What happens to students who are losing instructional time due to enrollment delays with the City of Angels?	Any instructional time lost due to enrollment delays can be discussed at an IEP team meeting. Parents always have the right to request an IEP team meeting.		
10	What happens if a parent requests a change of placement with the COA, but the IEP team, without the exception of the parent, decides against the change of placement?	Placement discussions and offers are discussed at the IEP team meeting by the entire team. Each IEP team member plays a vital role in helping the team decide the Least Restrictive Environment for the students and supports/services needed to receive a Free and Appropriate Public Education.
