





LAUSD SCHOOL EXPERIENCE SURVEY RESULTS 2018-19



The annual School Experience Survey for LAUSD presents survey items organized by three categories: Academics, Social Emotional Learning, and School Climate. The responses by survey items show the percent of responses from "Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree," as well as, aggregate percentages for the top two most positive responses (Agree/Strongly Agree). To begin, select the school from the dropdown menu. Then select the group and category to view the visualizations. District (LAUSD) and Local District is available also. Survey items with an asterisk are not included in the overall percentages for the content area.


SES Dashboard Selecting Group and Category










Examining SES Results

What do we do with all of this information?

Identify an area to focus on and begin by asking questions:







Examining SES Results


Examples of Questions based on the "What? So What? Now What?" Model:

What?

- What is the issue?
- What were your initial expectations?
- What outcome did you observe?
- What population is impacted?

2. So What?

- Why is the finding important?
- How is the finding different from what you expected?
- What impacts the way you view the finding?
 (What lens are you viewing from?)



3. Now What?

- How can we address this issue?
- What seems to be the root cause(s) of the issue?
- What other work is currently happening to address the issue?
- What would you need to learn more about related to this issue?
- What follow-up is needed to address any challenges or difficulties?

Identify an Area on which to Focus

What?	Response Rates are lower for parents than for staff or students.	
So What?	 We may not be hearing from an important subset of parents If we don't have a large enough sample of parents participate in the survey, then our results may not truly be reflective of how most parents feel. 	
Now What?	• We need to come up with ways to get more parents to participate.	





Now What?

Now that we've identified the problem, let's think about some possible solutions.



What can schools and the District do to get more parents to participate in the School Experience Survey?



Ways to Get More Parents to Participate in the School Experience Survey:

- ✓ Have computer lab open during parent-teacher conferences and encourage parents to take a few minutes to respond to the online Parent survey.
- ✓ Remind parents that the survey only takes a few minutes to complete
- Remind parents that they can take the survey online with their desktop, laptop, tablet or smartphone.
- ✓ Remind parents of how important their feedback is and how your school depends on SES results to make changes, etc.

— Step 1 (What?):

- Decide your area of interest (Academic, School Climate, or Social and Emotional Learning)
- Decide which content area you want to explore (e.g. connectedness and safety, behavior, technology)
- Decide which survey question or statement you want to investigate. Note: You may want to compare answers across groups (e.g. parents, staff and students)

— Step 2 (So What?):

- Look at the item and discuss what you think is going on and why your observation is important.
- Is the finding different than what you expected? Why? Why not?

— Step 3 (Now What?):

 Establish your action plan/next steps [e.g. person(s) responsible, timeline for completion]

- ✓ Which area of interest your group chose (e.g., Academics, School Climate, Social and Emotional Learning)

-So What?

- ✓ Based on your group's findings, what do you think is going on at your school?
- ✓ Why is this issue important?

-Now What?

✓ What does your group plan to do next as a result of what was learned today?
