

Benefits of a College-Going Culture

- Students from families in which no one has attended college before (First-Year College Student)















Benefits of a College-Going Culture

Why is it necessary to encourage a college-going culture? The shocking fact is that very few students are likely to complete even an associate degree:

• For every 100 students in the United States who begin ninth grade, 67 of them will finish high school in four years, 38 will go to college, and only 18 will earn associate degrees within three years or bachelor's degrees in six years.










WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

Dual enrollment refers to tuition-free college courses that are offered by East Los Angeles College on your high school campus.




- Students can use credits towards high school requirements

- LAUSD currently has more than 50 schools that offer Dual Enrollment at the high school level.



Supplemental Application for Admission of Students in Grades K-12

ADMISSION: Colleges in the Los Angeles Community College District ("LACCD") may admit as a special part-time or full-time student anyone who is a student in grades K-12 who has met the LACCD is admissionar requirements and who, in the opinion of the College President (or designee), may benefit from instruction. (Education Code sections 49800, 48800.5, 19800); LACCD Based Rules 8100.08, 8100.07, 8100.08; LACCD Administrative Regulation E-87.)

FEES: Enrollment fees are required for special full-time students (i.e., taking more than 11 units), but waived for special part-time students (i.e., taking 11 units or less). (Education Code section 78300(f), LACCD board Rule 3100.03.) Special part-time students are exempt from the non-resident full time fee (Education Code section 78140(s)(4), LACCD Board Rule 3100.03.) The LACCD short charges a health fee (cortain categories of students are exempt) and, where applicable, a student representation fee.

CONDITIONS: The student is expected to follow regulations and procedures that apply to all college students. The student shall receive college credit for the community college courses that the student completes. Arrangements for receiving high achical credit for completed course work must be made with the student's high school. The student may only enroll in those courses listed on this form. This annotates approved from must be presented when the student initially files an application for semission to the college, and as expensed approved must be provided for each semester or term in which the student whiles to enroll. The LACCD and its colleges assume no responsibility for the supervision of minor students (i.e., satisfacts under it's pears of age) outside the classroom seatting. Parents are responsible for ensuring that their children are appropriately supervised before class begins, after class finishes, or when a class is cancelled and/or dismissed early.



Things to keep in mind...


College Student = College Responsibility

The grade you earn in dual enrollment courses will be on your college transcript.

- A "D" is not a passing grade in college.
- Your grades in these courses will affect your financial aid eligibility once you graduate from high school
- You cannot repeat a course if you've received a "C" or better in it.
- A "W" is a withdrawal. If you find that you cannot successfully complete a course, you can avoid an F by dropping the course early. W's are counted as an attempt towards a class, and you may only attempt a course 3 times.
