# ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE









### GRADUATION RATE INCREASES FROM PRE-PANDEMIC LEVELS

The District's 2022–23 four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate is 84.0%, which represents a 4.9% increase since 2018–19 (79.1%). More students are completing their requirements for graduation and are Ready for the World.



### MORE STUDENTS MEETING UC/CSU COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

These are the students who graduate high school and meet all of the requirements for acceptance into University of California and California State University systems. More students are completing their entrance requirments and are now headed to college.

### EXPANSION OF UNIVERSAL TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN

Early childhood education is a predictor of future success and achievement. As such, it is imperative every 4-year-old in the Los Angeles school community has access to high quality learning opportunities. We are now offering that districtwide with our UTK program – two years earlier than the State's mandated timeline.

### RECOVERY EFFORTS -COMBATING CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM



Thanks to the iAttend initiative and intervention strategies, we have increased attendance rates and decreased chronic absenteeism across the District. The significant reduction in chronic absenteeism is nearly 10 percentage points lower than last year.

The iAttend initative combats chronic absenteeism by uncovering the underlying reasons for missed school days by employing a multitiered, collaborative strategy involving various tools and approaches districtwide. As part of the initiative, we have visited over 26,000 homes and 35 crisis housing centers.

### WINTER ACADEMY AND CONTINUITY OF LEARNING

174,000+ STUDENT PARTICIPANTS

Building on the success of last year's Acceleration Days, the Winter Academy provided students with the opportunity to explore important enriching concepts and receive additional individualized academic instruction with the support of a teacher. The Winter Break Continuity of Learning plan gave students digital activities that supported reading, writing and math.



### SUMMER OF LEARNING

120,000+ STUDENTS PARTICIPANTS

Students participated in a diverse range of activities – including arts, athletics, online enrichment courses and various academic and credit recovery programs. This marked the highest summer school attendance to date, showcasing the success and popularity of our summer initiatives in engaging and supporting students during the break.

Ford Boulevard Elementary & Dual Language Academy is the first Los Angeles Unified school recognized with the Seal of Excellence School Award by the California Association for Bilingual Education. ### **SCIENCE OF READING**

In our relentless pursuit of academic excellence, we are championing research-based, multisensory strategies to cater to the unique needs of every student and bolster their reading proficiency. 310 elementary schools have embraced the Core Knowledge Language Arts program. Furthermore, we're rolling out a comprehensive District Literacy Strategy, meticulously crafted to prioritize science-backed methodologies and tailored literacy standards for each grade level.

### SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENTS INCREASED MATH SCORES

Based on the 2022–23 Smarter Balanced Assessment results, Los Angeles Unified is making progress in Mathematics, as demonstrated by a two percentage point growth in the percent of students who met or exceed standards compared to 2021–22. This rate of improvement outpaces the statewide rate of improvement.

### BUILDING SYSTEMS, STRUCTURES AND COHERENCE

The Educational Transformation Office (ETO) plays a pivotal role in assisting Priority Schools by offering comprehensive support, resources and organizational structure which includes the Black Student Achievement Plan (BSAP). This includes strategic staffing to develop and retain effective leaders and staff, instructional support with a focus on culturally responsive professional development, progress monitoring and establishing partnerships with organizations to provide academic enrichment and support services to students and families.

### **EVERY SCHOOL SAFE BLUEPRINT** FOR SAFETY





The District developed a Blueprint for ensuring every campus is safe, welcoming and affirming for students, families and staff. From monthly trainings on critical topics such as cyberbullying, fentanyl awareness and campus threat response to developing partnerships with local municipalities, communitybased organizations and community leaders to ensure safe passage, the Blueprint reflects the strategic integration of District resources with external partnerships to address the physical, psychological, socialemotional and environmental well-being of our students and employees.

### FOOD TRUCKS

As part of the District's efforts to elevate school nutrition, Los Angeles Unified unveiled new food trucks to reinforce historic investments in school meals for students. The food trucks will provide nutritious meals at school sites and special celebrations while supporting career pathways for students interested in the culinary arts.



### **EXPANDED PHYSICAL AND** MENTAL TELEHEALTH

Joy and Wellness represents a whole-child focus wherein physical and mental health are considered equally as important as academic success. Through critical partnerships, the District has expanded access to physical and mental telehealth for students to ensure students receive the necessary care they deserve.

The Los Angeles Schools Anonymous Reporting (LASAR) mobile application enables the Los Angeles school community to anonymously report non-emergency incidents. This includes instances of suspicious activity, mental health incidents, drug consumption, drug trafficking, vandalism and other safety concerns to ensure campuses remain safe.

### SEVEN EDUCATION COMPACTS WITH LOCAL MUNICIPALITIES

We believe strengthening our engagement and partnerships with local governmental entities is in the best interest of meeting the needs of our students and the families and communities we serve. Education compacts with the municipal governments are intended to align resources and implement innovative programs to equip our students with the tools they need to be Ready for the World. Since Spring 2023, Los Angeles Unified has established seven education compacts with the cities of Bell, Cudahy, Huntington Park, Maywood, San Fernando, Vernon and West Hollywood.

### **EVERYONE MENTORS LA**

We believe public education is a collective good and the shared responsibility of the community. To make a difference in the lives of our students, Los Angeles Unified launched Everyone Mentors LA. To ensure every student graduates Ready for the World, this new mentoring initiative matches students contending with declining grades, chronic absenteeism, lack of social emotional support and other challenges that have inhibited their academic success with a mentor from the Los Angeles community.



## LAUSD MOBILE 5.2M+ **APP 3.0**



The Los Angeles Unified Mobile App is a one-stop mobile application and web portal for families and educators that includes a new resource menu featuring Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) accessibility, real-time information on student attendance, bus routes, Individualized Educational Plans and more. Milestones also include significant upgrades to the Parent Portal web access, establishing strong relationships with families through school workshops, programming and the recruitment of over 22,000 parent volunteers across the District.

# OPERATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS





### **\$850 MILLION GENERAL** OBLIGATION BONDS

Los Angeles Unified successfully sold \$850 million of our General Obligation Bonds, Series QRR, reflective of the District's strong credit profile. The Bonds are designated as Sustainability Bonds, funding both green and social projects, which helped generate specific orders from several institutional and retail investors helping meet their own social and green bond investment mandates.

### FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS AND GREEN SPACE UPGRADES

Over 400 facilities projects were completed for a total value of \$605 million and over \$883 million of projects are in planning and development to upgrade and modernize schools districtwide. This includes over 1.35 million sq ft. of greening projects that have been approved by the Board for total project value of \$242 million.



### **BUS FLEET ELECTRIFICATION**

The District purchased 180 electric buses to fully electrify the Sun Valley Bus Yard, representing the largest single-purchase in the nation.



### **TRANSPORTATION FOR ALL**

With an ever-growing fleet of electric school buses, we are reducing our carbon footprint one ride at a time. Families can save on gasoline costs by opting for the school bus while also contributing to a greener environment. Our buses are also equipped with Wi-Fi, turning travel time into an opportunity for learning and staying connected.

## INVESTING IN STAFF



### AGREEMENTS REACHED WITH 100% OF UNIONS LABOR NEGOTIATIONS

Historic agreements reached with SEIU Local 99, UTLA, AALA Units J & M, Teamsters Local 572, CSEA 500, LA-OC Building Trades and LASPA & LASPMA will help our employees meet the cost of living in Los Angeles.

Additionally, the District reached an agreement with the Health Benefits Committee to provide world class health and welfare benefits to employees and retirees through 2025, with no employee contribution.

These agreements demonstrate our commitment to respect and value every employee across the District. The contracts are precedent-setting across Los Angeles, California and the nation.



### **TEACHER OF THE YEAR**

Mr. Andrew Lewis, a high school music teacher from Ramon C. Cortines School of Visual and Performing Arts, was named 2024 California Teacher of the Year by State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond. Mr. Lewis has been recognized as an ambassador for the profession and honored as a representative of the state for the calendar year.



### **BUS DRIVER OF THE YEAR**

Ms. Tamara Conley was named the California Highway Patrol Southern Region School Bus Driver of the Year. Ms. Conley has been a dedicated Los Angeles Unified bus driver for 36 years, has 30 years of accident-free driving and 15 years of perfect attendance. This has earned her multiple accolades and great respect from her students, peers and co-workers.



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
