### **Action Proposed:**

### Background:

Procurement Services staff prepares monthly reports for contract actions necessary for the execution of the projects approved by the Board for the educational and operational requirements of the District in accordance with Board delegated authority to the Superintendent.

### **Expected Outcomes:**

Approval of these items will allow the goods and services provided by these contracts furnishing the equipment, supplies, or services to the Los Angeles Unified School District that support Board policies and goals.

### **Board Options and Consequences:**

The Board can approve all actions presented, or postpone selected actions pending receipt of additional information. Non-ratification of actions awarded under delegated authority in Attachment "A" will result in immediate unavailability of products or discontinuance of services, or both. While non-ratification may be legally defendable, it would likely result in costly litigation over discontinued payments or if the District attempts to reclaim payments made to a vendor. District costs will likely increase as fewer vendors compete for future procurements. Postponement of actions presented for approval in Attachment "B" will delay contract award or delivery dates.

### **Policy Implications:**

This action does not change District policy and conforms to California Education Code section 17604 that permits the Board of Education to delegate authority for Procurement Services (Board Report #474-13/14), which the Board exercised on June 10, 2014.

### Introduction:

The item is a contract for the AB86 Adult Education Planning Grant. The Los Angeles Regional Adult Education Consortium (LARAEC) was allocated \$1.7 million to collaborate with other K-12 districts and the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) to develop plans for regional adult education services. LAUSD's request in the amount of \$476,386 was allocated by LARAEC. The funds must be expended by June 30, 2015.

The Los Angeles Community College District is fiscal agent for the Planning Grant for LARAEC. The funds came from the state to the fiscal agent (LACCD) last spring; however, the procedures for distributing the funds to the members of the consortium caused a delay in the receipt of the funds. The AB86 Planning Grant Certification of Eligibility Instructions, Terms and Conditions issued by the State of California through legislative action required the consortium member districts (including LAUSD) to initiate planning grant activities before any payments from the state to the consortium were released.

### Why is this necessary?

The ratification of this contract is necessary in order to secure reimbursement funding for the District's AB86 2014-15 adult education consortium planning grant activities. The AB86 Consortium Planning Grant for LAUSD has utilized the same funding mechanism as is used for all of the District's reimbursement grants. Revenue from the grant is estimated and a budget is established in the District's BTS system. After expenditures are incurred, reports are filed with the granting agency and reimbursement of those expenditures is sent to the District.

### Why is this contract an After the Fact? [if it is an after-the-fact]

The AB86 Planning Grant Certification of Eligibility Instructions, Terms and Conditions issued by the State of California through legislative action, required the consortium member districts (including LAUSD) to begin the work and initiate planning grant activities before any payments from the state to the consortium were released.

### Why do we need to do this now?

APPROVED

AB86 is the only funding mechanism available for adult education consortium planning grant activities.

- c) education programs for adults with disabilities;
- d) short-term career technical education programs with high employment potential; and
- e) program for apprentices.

The Information Technology Division (ITD) is requesting Board of Education approval of agreements to provide alternate sources of Internet access at locations where standard infrastructure installation is cost prohibitive or otherwise unfeasible. The following table provides detail on the individual agreements and the types of services to be provided:

### Why is this necessary?

Supporting its commitment to instructional technology, the District is implementing a comprehensive plan to provide high-quality Internet access to students, teachers, administrators, and staff. The proposed contracts would provide 1) wireless connectivity service to required District locations where wired network infrastructure is not readily available and/or cost prohibitive, and 2) commercially available bundled Internet access service to provide alternative high bandwidth access for fixed remote sites or groups of users where high speed network such as scalable fiber is not available or cost prohibitive.

### Why do we need to do this now?

The existing infrastructure cannot support the rapidly increasing demand for Internet access for instructional and assessment purposes. Further, the District's risk in missing deadlines to apply for federal E-rate discounts increases with any delays in approval.

### What would happen if this were not approved?

The potential for disruptions in service will increase as demand for Internet access increases across District locations. Students and teachers will continue to be limited by the existing infrastructure, which cannot support growing demands for Internet access.

## APPROVED

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

All agreements are for a three-year period beginning no sooner than March 11, 2015 with two one-year options. The total aggregate value of the potential five-year period is not to exceed \$9.5 million. These contracts will be funded via General Funds. Estimated E-Rate discounts for schools are projected to cover 78% of these costs.

APPROVE AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE AN OUT-OF-BAND MANAGEMENT

**SOLUTION** 

The Information Technology Division (ITD) is requesting Board approval to enter an agreement with Vega Business Technologies to provide an Out-of-Band Management (OOBM) solution. Once implemented, the solution will minimize network downtime, allowing schools to take maximum advantage of online educational opportunities.

### Why is this necessary?

Providing a reliable technology experience for our students requires our ability to diagnose and resolve network deficiency problems quickly. Under current practice using "in-band" network problem resolution, a systems administrator may become aware of a network issues, but cannot ascertain specific details about the problem without being physically dispatched to the location to diagnose the problem and restore functionality.

The Out of Band Management (OOBM) project, approved by the Board of Education in June 2014, provides the capabilities to alert network technicians about problems and allow them to diagnose and resolve the problems without having to be physically present at the location.

### Why do we need to do this now?

Instructional technology initiatives that include computer adaptive assessments requires us to minimize network downtime.

### What would happen if this were not approved?

Without an OOBM solution, the District will continue to rely on 'in-band' management techniques, which are inefficient.

### What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The proposed agreement is for a five-year term including two one-year options. The total contract value is not to exceed \$2,851,875. Source of funding is 100% Bond fund.
