Background:

Procurement Services staff prepares monthly reports for contract actions necessary for the execution of the projects approved by the Board for the educational and operational requirements of the District in accordance with Board delegated authority to the Superintendent.

Expected Outcomes:

Approval of these items will allow the goods and services provided by these contracts furnishing the equipment, supplies, or services to the Los Angeles Unified School District that support Board policies and goals.

Board Options and Consequences:

The Board can approve all actions presented, or postpone selected actions pending receipt of additional information. Non-ratification of actions awarded under delegated authority in Attachment "A" will result in immediate unavailability of products or discontinuance of services, or both. While non-ratification may be legally defendable, it would likely result in costly litigation over discontinued payments or if the District attempts to reclaim payments made to a vendor. District costs will likely increase as fewer vendors compete for future procurements. Postponement of actions presented for approval in Attachment "B" will delay contract award or delivery dates.

Policy Implications:

This action does not change District policy and conforms to *California Education Code section 17604* that permits the Board of Education to delegate authority for Procurement Services (Board Report #474-13/14), which the Board exercised on June 10, 2014.



Introduction

College Summit will work with Jordan High School to identify the most influential students in our 2015 graduating class and enlist these students into our corps of "College Summit Peer Leaders." College Summit will provide Jordan with curricula that will help our students focus on planning for and financing their future after high school. Additionally, our "Peer Leaders" will receive intensive training and then share with their classmates their enthusiasm for college and their college entrance know-how, including how to apply and how to pay for higher education. College Summit will also help Jordan track students' progress toward achieving essential milestones, like submitting their college and financial aid applications. With College Summit as a partner, we hope to see an increase in the number of seniors applying for and getting into post-secondary education.

College Summit is providing these services at no cost to Jordan because College Summit has received funding from Melanie Lundquist, a major philanthropist dedicated to improving public education in Los Angeles and the primary funder of the Partnership for Los Angeles Schools. Mrs. Lundquist has specifically identified College Summit as the entity to provide these services and Jordan as the school to receive these services. Mrs. Lundquist's grant, which will be received by College Summit (not by Jordan), will cover all of the costs of these services. Thus, Jordan will receive these services at no cost.

The reports will also include detailed information on which institutions students are attending. College Summit will also be working with us to create an action plan based on an analysis of the data.

Why do we need to do this now?

College Summit is needed to help more Jordan students apply to and succeed in higher education. The college application process is ongoing now.

What would happen if this were not approved?



Many Jordan students would not have the support they need to be successful in the college application process and Jordan would be unable to receive thousands of dollars of free services and benefit from a donation made to College Summit on Jordan's behalf.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The services are to be provided from December 03, 2014 through June 30, 2015, at no cost to the District.

This project by the Los Angeles Unified School District, Educational Services Center West (LAUSD) and the School of Education's Family of Schools (FOS) at Loyola Marymount University (LMU) will meet the Absolute Priority of the U.S. Department of Education's 2014 Professional Development for Arts Educators Program Grant (PR/AWARD NUMBER U351C140064) by implementing a minimum 40-hour professional development program for K-12 arts educators and other instructional staff that uses innovative instructional methods and current knowledge from education research and focuses on the development, enhancement of Common Core standards based arts professional development.

Both LMU School of Education and Dr. Jacqueline Mattis are named-in-grant as Arts Education Professional Development Provider and Program Evaluator respectively. Loyola Marymount University through its Family of Schools Collaborative will provide a high quality professional development opportunity to meet the Visual Arts Historical and Cultural Standard for grades 1-5. LAUSD teachers will meet the Historical and Cultural Standard by learning from LMU's African American and Chicano Departments' cultural and historical experts, and be trained by local Master artists and educators.

This project is consistent with LAUSD policies supporting arts integration, culturally-relevant pedagogy and the Common Core State Standards

Why do we need to do this now?

LMU and ESC West were awarded a grant under the US Department of Education. Approval by the Board will enable program implementation in 6 schools. The terms of the grant require that program begin operation during the first award year (2014-2015).

If the Board does not approve these contracts, the program will not be developed in these schools and the funding will be forfeited.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

Grant funding will be extended over a four year period, with annual reauthorizations by the Department of Education. Should the federal grant funding not be reauthorized for the complete term of the grant award, the agreements with LMU and Jacqueline Mattis will also terminate without further obligation to the District.

NETWORK EQUIPMENT FOR SCHOOL MODERNIZATION PROJECTS

The Information Technology Division (ITD) is requesting Board approval to award contract(s) to AAA Solar Electric, Inc. to replace aging and obsolete network equipment needed to modernize school local area networks (LANs) and add new wireless network equipment at 206 school sites.

Why is this necessary?

Schools need reliable networks that provide high capacity and high-density Internet access for all students and employees. Accomplishing this objective requires replacing obsolete network equipment that have high failure rates, have exceeded the manufacturer's recommended end of life, and/or are no longer supported. The proposed agreements will enable us to replace network equipment at 206 school sites (see attached list).

Why do we need to do this now?

Network equipment at the 206 school sites ranges from 7 and 14 years old, well beyond the expected lifespan of five years. Older, obsolete equipment carries with it a high rate of failure, does not meet modern performance standards, and is no longer supported by manufacturers. Until network equipment is replaced, school networks will continue to see network failures, which disrupts classroom instruction. Increased failures also create a higher demand for technical support, increasing the burden on the general fund.

What would happen if this were not approved?

Without approval, networks at 206 schools will continue to experience network failures at a high rate, disrupting teaching and learning. Increasing numbers of resources will be needed to accommodate higher support needs. Lack of approval also puts the District at risk of failing to qualify for federal E-rate funds, which are available only during a limited window.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The agreements are for a two-year period beginning February 11, 2015 thru February 10, 2017 with two (2) one-year option years. The total aggregate value of the potential four-year period is not to exceed \$21,465,133. These contracts will be funded via Bond Funds; no General Funds will be expended.

Why is this necessary?

In order to ensure that District students will continue to have equity of access to televised instructional programs to support the District's curriculum; and that KLCS can continue to provide general programming consistent with its Federal Communications Commission (FCC) mandates, KLCS is requesting approval of \$466,400 for programming acquisition and related services provided by the Public Broadcasting Service.

KLCS-TV is requesting the Board of Education's approval to continue membership in the Public Broadcasting Service (PBS), and to acquire programming from its National Program Service, for FY 2014 - 2015 in order to provide instructional and educational television programming to the students, teachers, parents and caregivers of the District. This programming will be broadcast over four digital television channels, and will be funded entirely from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting grants, grants which cannot be used for any purpose other than the acquisition and production of programming.

Why do we need to do this now?

As the noncommercial educational public television station licensed to the LAUSD, KLCS has participated in the Public Broadcasting Service (PBS) programming service for over thirty years, and relies upon this resource to provide a substantial amount of educational content for broadcast:

- Over 2500 hours of educational, instructional and general audience television programs distributed via the KLCS broadcast schedule for students, teachers, parents, caregivers and the community of Greater Los Angeles.
- Support materials and resources for classroom teachers and students
- Content to support the District's "Signal to Desktop" video project for classrooms district
- Community Outreach resources to support programming initiatives

What would happen if this were not approved?

KLCS would be required to forfeit its PBS membership, would lose a significant amount of program content, and would have to acquire programming directly from individual vendors which would increase acquisition costs. As one of the most watched public television stations in the United States, KLCS relies upon the PBS National Program Schedule to provide a significant percentage of its classroom television programs, distributed directly to District classrooms via over-the-air broadcast, cable transmission, satellite transmission and via digital receivers directly to students and teachers computer desktops in District classrooms. This programming is integral to the instructional services provided by KLCS and represents the most-highly viewed programs on the District's television station.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

Access to 25% of the PBS National Program Service for one year.

Why is the proposed agreement being requested after the fact?

Due to lack of funds, KLCS was unable to make a Request For Procurement Action until it received a new round of funding from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) on November 7, 2014. This lack of funds is the result of a 50% budget reduction in FY 2012 – 2013 that forced the Station to deploy grant monies normally reserved for program acquisitions to fund critical positions. While the District has restored funding for a reduced roster of positions, it has not provided funding for any other expenses, including program acquisitions. Because of this and the lingering impact of the FY 2012 – 2013 budget reductions, KLCS began FY 2015 with only \$77,740 in available funds after payroll encumbrances. Since KLCS relies upon the PBS National Program Schedule to provide a significant percentage of its classroom television programs, and without these programs KLCS would be unable to fulfill its core mission of providing instructional programming to the District's students, the Station was compelled to continue its membership in PBS while waiting for the new CPB funding to be in place.

The Information Technology Division (ITD) is seeking Board approval to award a zero-cost extension to an existing agreement with AVAYA (contract no. 4400000365) for Private Branch Exchange (PBX) equipment, peripheral devices, accessories, installation, and maintenance services to support new and existing District telecommunications projects.

Why is this necessary?

The District's existing contract with AVAYA expires on February 28, 2015. An extension would enable the District to continue providing basic telecommunications equipment and services for another year. As the existing contract value has sufficient capacity for anticipated expenditures through 2016, no increases in the total contract value are needed.

Why do we need to do this now?

The existing contract with AVAYA will expire on February 28, 2015. Granting the extension now guarantees that the District can continue to purchase AVAYA products at the negotiated discount rates.

What would happen if this were not approved?

Without approval, the District would be without a vehicle to purchase parts, materials, and maintenance services for AVAYA products at pre-negotiated prices, leading to substantially increased telecommunications costs to the District.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The proposed agreement is for a period of one-year beginning February 28, 2015 and ending February 28, 2016. No increase in the contract value is needed.

AGREEMENTS FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

The Information Technology Division (ITD) is requesting Board-approval to implement a comprehensive plan to continue providing high-quality voice and data services at minimal cost to the District. To achieve this strategy, the District intends to utilize an existing State of California contract vehicle known as CALNET 3 to secure high-volume, pre-negotiated volume discounts.

Background

A Note about the E-rate Program: The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) recently announced changes in the E-rate program eligibility rules shifting the focus away from voice services in favor of data services.

Starting in 2015, the maximum eligibility reimbursement rate for some services will be reduced by a set percentage over a five-year period, following which the services will no longer be eligible for E-rate reimbursements. Early analysis indicates that this could have a potential general fund impact of \$70.5 million over the next five years.

These recent changes increase the urgency to secure the lowest-cost available as we work to identify alternative funding strategies over the next several years. We are confident that our strategy to utilize CALNET 3 provides the District with the best available pricing for these critical services. We are projecting average savings of 47% by using the CALNET 3 agreements. These savings will partially mitigate the reduction of E-rate reimbursements.

CALNET 3: CALNET 3 was developed by the state through an intensive two-year competitive bidding process and provides what we consider to be the best available pricing on a variety of telecommunications and related services (see Table 1).

For each of the services listed below, the Procurement Services and Information Technology Divisions conducted informal request for proposals, allowing the Calnet 3-qualified, preapproved vendors to compete for contracts with the District (see Table 1 for details).
