Outreach workers will continue to operate in the field. Selected community non-profit homeless services providers offer nightly shelter to homeless persons, adult single men and women in Los Angeles County. If it is a youth, family, or adult seeking shelter, they can also download the win app on mobile devices. As space may be limited, those in need of emergency shelter should contact the shelter hotline to determine the best way to gain admittance into a shelter. Most shelters will open at approximately 5pm. Hope of the Valley shelter in the San Fernando Valley is closed as of April 21<sup>st</sup>. Immediate shelter is not guaranteed.

Overview:	<p>The Rescue Mission Alliance San Fernando Valley provides shelter and guidance for homeless families at their Home Again Family Success Center in Northridge. The family shelter offers families the opportunity to recover from the devastating effects of homelessness by meeting the basic needs of food, clothing, and shelter while identifying the underlying reasons for becoming homeless and establishing a plan of restoration.</p> <p>Their Renewed Hope Recovery Program located in Hollywood, serves homeless men living with issues of substance abuse and other self-destructive behaviors. In addition to shelter, food, clothing, and case management services, participants receive classroom instruction and individual and group therapy sessions. They engage the unsheltered homeless on the streets through their Survival Outreach Services program, providing hot showers, clothing, hygiene products, haircuts, and meals. The mission's mobile shower unit travels to churches strategically located throughout the San Fernando Valley to meet the needs of those living on the streets. Delivering showers and meals to homeless members of the community helps build relationships that lead to positive steps toward addressing the root causes of their homelessness and setting them on the path to recovery.</p>
