**Overview:** SPY works with youth ages 12–25 who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness. Young people can access our continuum of services in a safe, welcoming space. SPY's Drop-In Access Center helps youth meet basic survival needs of meals, showers and clothing; improve physical and emotional wellbeing; and develop meaningful relationships with peers, staff and the community.

**Overview:** This program provides emergency shelter to Transition Age Youth (TAY) (age 18–25) with mental health issues that are experiencing homelessness. The program includes linkage to a DMH Clinician and Housing Specialist who are assigned to the shelters. Youth can be on parole/probation, if they have been released from the psychiatric hospital, they must come with 30 days of medication. Cannot be under LPS Conservatorship.

There are 3 locations in the Hollywood area, 3 locations in South LA, 1 location in Central LA, and 1 location in the San Fernando Valley. Housing is provided on a first come first serve basis. Clients cannot be receiving social security benefits, no immigration status required, no ID required, if they have a DCFS case open, the youth can self-refer, but their social worker must provide a letter if requested by the Intake Specialist. PSA Counselors at the YouthSource/AJCC Centers, also serve as the main provider for the Truancy Diversion Program, a deterrent alternative for students in violation of the daytime curfew law.

The Economic & Workforce Development Department (EWDD) has 16 WorkSource Centers located throughout Los Angeles. The WorkSource Centers offer free employment services to adults, dislocated workers, veterans, the homeless and the re-entry population.

Services include:
